- SMART Bond SMART-Speakers

History of the SMART program. District identified over \$3 billion of improvements, after conducting a needs analysis. Initially passed for external needs of the building (such as HVAC) so teachers may focus on teaching and learning. AECOM brought on board (new project manager).

HHE is currently in Phase 3, the Project Design. Submitted to building department for approval and a permit. Revising and resubmitting. Anticipating an approval letter early summer (late May/early June). This is goal. Primary renovations include building envelope improvements, HVAC improvements, Fire sprinklers, electrical improvements and safety/security upgrades. Roof replacement on buildings 1, 2, 8, 13 and new aluminum walkway. Exterior painting of 6 buildings. New windows on building 2. Door replacement of safety hardware on buildings 1 and 2. Replacement of duct heaters, modern control system. Electrical improvements in buildings 1, 2, 10, 13—exterior lighting fixtures, emergency lighting (new and replacement of existing fixtures), replacement of distribution panels.

School Choice Enhancement Program: Marleine Ghaby

We have made a lot of progress. Student teacher laptops, ipads, digital marquee, car loop fencing, outdoor network access point, Aiphone, NovoPros, EarthWalk Carts and wiring. Hardening school security. Aiphone will be replaced by the district with an H4 digital camera, this will be connected to security system. There will also be a panic button. Head custodian must be in attendance of Aiphone, so they can call PPO. 94% completion of SCEP improvements. Encourage that we spend the remainder soon.

- Mid-Year Reflection

Long term goal. Focus on improving math and reading scores for lowest quartile. Students in lowest quartile are underperforming in these areas, compared to peers not in lowest quartile. By 2021-2022, students in lowest quartile will increase learning gains by 5%, measured by ELA i-ready scores. Intervention training continuing to occur, Stacey Vidal (Resource teacher) will pull interventions. 58% increase in reading in lowest quartile, 57% increase in math in lowest quartile.
