Please ensure that your child is reading daily to increase content knowledge. Knowledge is power and the more your child reads, the more proficient they will become.

In Math, we purchased First in Math to increase fluency. Students can do it at home at their own pace. This program has proven to be successful if used daily KG-5th

Students must also complete their iReady personalized pathway in reading and Math. Not more the 45 minutes PER WEEK in each content area. Parents you can check child's progress under "my report" on the iReady App.

COVID-19 Update

As you are aware that the Omicron variant is fast spreading among adults and children. Many are experiencing flu-like symptoms with a scratchy throat and running nose. If your child experiences flu-like symptoms – keep your child at home till they are symptom free. We offer testing at school for Griffin children and staff only. Safety is our highest priority. If

your child comes to school sick, they will be sent to the nurse to get a focused assessment and may be sent home. The nurse will instruct you with the next steps. Due to legislation signed into law by Florida Governor Ron DeSantis, facial coverings will not be mandatory in schools, however Broward Schools strongly encourages it. Additionally, no asymptomatic students or employees will be required to quarantine if they are a close contact due to COVID exposure.





We would also like to ask that you assist your child in completing their weekly iReady minutes in Reading and Math, 45 minutes is required for each. Thank you so much for your help with this requirement.

Our next field trip is scheduled for February 8th to Flamingo Gardens. We hope the students enjoy the natural scenery, beautiful plants and learn about some of the interesting animals and their habitats.

Also, we just received notice that our Food Share Table and Food Donation initiatives can start back up in the new year. It's a great way to eliminate waste in the cafeteria. Please talk to your children about donating any unopened/uneaten to our program. One of our biggest items are unopened milk cartons. **Students are NOT required to take**

a milk. They are required to take 3 food items; one must be a fruit or vegetable.

Just a reminder to bring your old towels, linens, clothes and shoes to be recycled at Griffin. We get 10% of the proceeds. Collection bin has been relocated to the Bus loop parking lot, on the outside of the fence for easy off hour access.



Also, remember to recycle at home and keep it free of contamination. If you are not sure if it can be recycled, toss it in the trash. At school we recycle clean, empty water bottles, soda bottles and juice bottles; as well as cardboard (no pizza boxes), paper. All film plastic, such as grocery plastic bags and storage bags can be recycled at Publix or Walmart, not in your city recycling bin. Learn more at coopercityfl.org and search recycling.

The food forest is thriving. Thanks to a grant from the Whole Kids Foundation and a generous donor we have a large variety of Sugar Apples, Jack Fruit, Bananas, Sapodilla, and Mango.
