INTRODUCTIONS: (about 10-15 seconds)

- A. Relate the introduction to ideas that are or might be discussed for debate.
 - 1. Use a quotation; and/or
 - 2. Use an analogy; and/or
 - 3. Use statistics to raise awareness of a problem
- B. State your team's purpose
- C. Conclude introduction with stating which side the judge should vote on (the side you are on aff/pro or neg/con).
- *Do not state your name and school.

Example: "My partner and I stand on the (side) of the resolve: (state the resolve).

CONCLUSIONS: (about 10-15 seconds)

- A. State your team's primary contentions
- B. Conclude with reminding the judge which side they should vote on (the side you are on aff/pro or neg/con).
- *Similar to the introduction
