#### **Mission Statement**

### **Engagement of Parents and Families**

Parents are involved in the Title 1 program through monthly parent activities that begin early in the year with our Annual Title 1 Meeting and Open House. This meeting informs parents of the many components of the Title 1 Program, introduces them to the school's curriculum and various assessments in each subject area, and recruits parents to become part of the school's decision-making process. Our procedure of combining SAC/SAF, and Family Nights into one evening continues to be successful in terms of providing parents a forum for participation in school events. Parents have the opportunity to attend staggered activities that involve them on several levels. SAC/SAF meetings throughout the year offer parents a vehicle for input into how parental involvement funds are used, what items should be included in the Title 1 Home-School Parent Compact and Annual Title 1 Parent Survey, and also keep parents informed as to the implementation of the School Improvement Plan.

Dr. MLK Montessori Academy keeps the parents/families up-to-date on Title 1 issues and various ways to communicate with the school. A Title 1 bulletin is sent home via backpacks with all students in early September to inform parents as the location of the school and district Parent Involvement Policies, and ways to access the School Improvement Plan. The bulletin contains copies in multiple languages of the Parent Right to Know Letter. Information is provided on the Parent Involvement Resource Center (PIRC). The school's website contains a section on Title 1 activities and features each parent night with photographs and news releases.

# Flexible Parent Meetings
