A Message from the Literacy Coach Megan Chase

Hi parents. My name is Megan Chase and I'm the new Literacy Coach for Fox Trail Elementary. I look forward to working with everyone to help add to your child's success in reading.

As a school, we are currently working on increasing student's language skills and their ability to have a conversation about what they are learning. Our new county reading assessment, the BAS (Benchmark Assessment System), relies on these conversations in order to assess the student's comprehension. The teachers have been working on increasing these meaningful conversations within their instruction.

But, who is your child's first teacher? You are, of course! Did you know that you increase your child's listening vocabulary every time you speak to them? Children learn the sounds of our language, how people talk to each other, ask questions, learn the meanings of words, and find out about the important things around them from you. These experiences of listening and talking prepare children to be successful readers. We call this background knowledge.

Here are some things you can do at home:

- * Talk, sing, and read frequently with your children. Even older children benefits from these interactions.
- * Use expanded sentences instead of just a few words. For example, rather than saying, "Come to the table." you might say, "Please come to the table for dinner. It's hot and ready for everyone to enjoy."
- * Ask questions that require more than a yes or no answer.
 - o A great three letter word is "WHY??" This prompt requires more than a one word response.
- * Books provide great opportunities for conversation.
 - o Why do you think that happened?
 - o How does the character feel? What made you think that?
 - o Did something like that ever happen to you? Tell me about it.

Bottom line, TALK IT UP! Together we can build stronger readers. Just remember, you're creating memories your child will never forget.

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
