- if you think people are ready to vote - **previous question**

SAC/SIP: SBBC POLICY 1403 SCHOOL ACCOUNTABILITY & IMPROVEMENT:

Each school has a School Advisory Council (SAC) to facilitate the development and monitor progress of the annual School Improvement Plan. Agendas and minutes reflect annual needs assessment, SIP monitoring and allocation of Accountability Funds.

SAF: SBBC POLICY 1.3 SCHOOL ADVISORY FORUM:

Every school shall have a School Advisory Forum (SAF) that shall foster and promote communication between stakeholders, the school, and the Area Advisory Council. The SAF shall bring forth recommendations, concerns and interests to and from their Area Advisory Council.

REVIEW & UPLOAD BYLAWS OCT 8

- School Advisory councils need to review their Bylaws annually and revise them using the SAC Bylaws Template.
- Once the Bylaws have been revised and approved by SAC, they need to be submitted through the SAC Documentation Upload Center on the BCPS SIP.
- Schools are also expected to post their SAC Bylaws on their website, maintain a hard copy of their annual SAC Bylaws in the school's main office and ensure that they are available for anyone who may wish to see them.

SECTIONS THAT CAN BE REVISED IN THE BYLAWS

- Article III - Section 3. Length of Term: Members of the School Advisory Council shall be elected for (ONE, TWO, Or THREE) year term(s)
- Article IV - Section 1. Officers of this committee will consist of (A CHAIRPERSON, CO-CHAIRPERSONS) and secretary.
- Article IV - Section 2. The officers shall be elected annually at the (AUGUST, SEPTEMBER, OCTOBER, APRIL, MAY, JUNE) meeting.
- Article IV - Section 3. Installation of new officers will be held at the (FIRST, SECOND) meeting of the school year

Specials is using thematic units this year. Our first theme is shapes. Here is what each special has been doing.

Art: Creating artwork with geometric shapes and irregular shapes.

Spanish: Writing sentences in Spanish to describe shapes.

Computers: In primary grades, we are using Kidspiration to create projects using different types of shapes (similar and congruent shapes).

STEM: 2D AND 3D shapes and tessellations.

PE: 360, 180 and 90 degree turns and left/right directions.

From now through the end of the first quarter our focus in math will be basic facts within 20 and three-digit place and number sense.

- Our focus in reading will be central idea and details, text features, story elements, and plot structure.
- Our science focus will be interdependence with plants and animals
- In social studies we have covered our geography standards.
- Our writing focus will be expository essays.

3rd Grade



- From now through the end of the first quarter our focus in math will be on adding, subtracting, estimating, graphing, and multiplication.
- Our focus in reading will be implementing Unit 1 of Benchmark Advance and utilizing the iReady LAFS book to support the standard of focus. Standards covered in quarter 1 are main idea, compare/contrast, recounting stories, describing characters, theme, and inferencing.
- Our science focus will be classifying plants and animals and natural resources.

4th Grade



- From now through the end of the first quarter our focus in math will be on improving multiplication fluency and remediating in lowest performing math lessons.
- Our focus in reading will be implementing Benchmark Advance and using an array of resources for students to show proficiency in 4th grade reading skills. In addition, provide writing support for students to response to a writing based on what they have read.
- Our science focus will be covering science skills related to Earth and Space Science while using Microsoft One Notebook.

5TH Grade



Our beginning of year assessments for math and reading were iready Diagnostic for Reading and Math and the Math Prerequisite. We are also working on BAS assessments to determine our students' reading levels.

- These assessments impact how we plan our instruction, for example in small reading groups based on the student data teachers may sort students by ability level to guide instruction.
- For small math groups teachers may be grouping students based on their diagnostic results.
- We are in the middle of the quarter.
- In reading we've focused on reviewing reading expectations and routines and we have begun Unit one of Benchmark Advanced.
- In math we've focused on Unit 1 which focused on multi number multiplication, division, base ten, exponents and order of operations.
- From now through the end of the first quarter our focus in math will be multi digit multiplication, division, base ten, exponents and order of operations, and adding and subtracting decimals
- In reading our novel study is Esperanza Rising. Our unit one theme is natural resources focusing on central ideas and details, text structure, text features, author's perspective and learning how to write an expository essay.
- Our science focus will be nature of science and environmental changes and .
- Our social studies focus will be Native Americans and Explorers, Agriculture and Hispanic Heritage.
- Our writing focus will be writing an expository essay.
