Cambridge Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) Advanced Placement (AP)

Dual Enrollment (DE)

AICE provides an advanced academic preuniversity qualification for students who are studying Cambridge International A and AS Levels. The Cambridge AICE program offers students the opportunity to tailor their studies to individual interests, abilities, and future plans. The program combines breadth of study with choice and flexibility. The Cambridge AICE program involves the selection of subjects from three curriculum areas: Mathematics and Science, Languages, and Arts & Humanities.

The Advanced Placement (AP) Program provides college-level courses and exams in various subject areas for students in secondary schools. More than 2,900 universities and colleges worldwide grant credit, advanced placement, or both to students who have performed satisfactorily on the exams, and approximately 1,400 institutions grant sophomore standing to students who have demonstrated their competence in three or more of these exams.

Dual enrollment is a program that allows high school students to simultaneously earn college or vocational credit while also earning credit toward a high school diploma. Dual enrollment courses are free. Instructional materials (such as books) are provided to public school students free of charge; however, students enrolled in home education programs or nonpublic secondary schools must provide their own materials.
