Hello Nova Fisenhower Family! This month's safety tip is about social media. Most of our children either have cell phones or tablets and have access to different social media platforms. Though most of their social media activity is legitimately with their friends and classmates, there is always the chance that the child they believe they are speaking to is not who they say they are. As we all know, young children are trusting and are naïve to a lot of the dangers of the world. Our job as parents and protectors is to shield them from all dangers seen and unseen. I'm asking that all parents please monitor your children's social media access and please monitor who they are speaking to while they are online. Predators routinely use social media outlets to prey on young children of all demographics. In addition to monitoring your children's online activity, those parents who are comfortable with the idea can also install GPS monitoring on your children's cell phones. There are several free apps that can be installed and allow you to know your child's whereabouts at all times. If your children are anything like mine, they are more concerned with a fully charged cell phone than a full belly so it's a good way to always know where they are. I'm aware that some parents may feel that "tracking" their child is an invasion of their privacy but if an unfortunate situation occurs, this could be a helpful tool to assist law enforcement in locating your child. With the holiday season approaching and lots of upcoming free time for children I thought it important to share this information with you all. Social and Emotional Learning (SEL)

As we continue to explore and learn about the five core competencies of SEL, here is another technique that has been shared on our morning announcements for our weekly **Mindful Mo-ments** segment. This strategy is called **Rock the Baby.** Here is how it works:

1. Begin by sitting up tall in Sitting Mountain.

2. Lift your right foot up onto your left knee and flex your foot to engage your foot and leg. Hold onto your foot with your left hand and take your right knee into your right hand.

3. Keeping your spine nice and straight, lift your right leg up and in toward your chest to cradle it like a baby. Gently rock your baby from side to side.

4. Gently release your leg. Switch legs to rock your other baby

Respect means showing consideration, understanding and regard for people, places and things.
