Grade/Specials Update

Prekindergarten

In April, preschoolers will celebrate Earth Day. Classes will explore recycling and how to take care of our amazing planet. Each in their own way, classes will continue to focus on nature and natural life around us. Remember to ask your child about the plants and animals you see. How does the bird move? Can you help your child use descriptive and positional words? (For example: The bird is above the mailbox and below the tree branch.) Help your child make a spring bird feeder by spreading a thin layer of peanut butter over a cardboard tube and rolling it in bird seed. Another fun learning activity is to save your plastic eggs from your child's spring basket. Write numerals on them in sharpie marker. Then have your child refill the eggs with the exact number of jellybeans or little gems. Let's make math and science fun and relevant to our little learners!

First Grade

First grade is reenergized and ready after Spring Break! In Math, we are learning about measurement and data. Please continue to practice addition and subtraction facts with your child. In Science, we are learning about stars and constellations! In ELAR, the students will be learning words with the long e and long i spelling patterns as well as noun- verb agreement. In writing, the students are learning how to write expository how- to papers. We are also learning about the past, present, and future by comparing and contrasting the stories we read. The first grade End of Year Reading Test is coming up on May 2nd and 3rd. Please read with your student each day for at least 20 minutes and discuss the book to help prepare them! Remember to check your child's folder and homework agenda every day for updates. Thanks for all you do!



Music

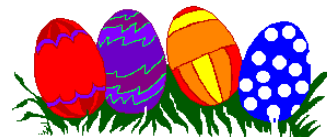

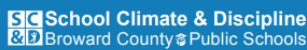
