I would like to have an honest conversation about our current educational state. Our beginning of the year school data indicates a gap exists for our students as a result of school closures in March.

Our focus needs to be directed at closing the learning gap. We cannot allow the Pandemic to have consequences for our children that may travel with them as they continue their educational career.

Here are our instructional goals for this school year:

- Increase the ability of students to read fluently (rate, prosody, accuracy)
- Advance student overall reading ability by a minimum of one year
- Increase math fluency of basic math skills (adding, subtracting, multiplying, dividing)
- Advance comprehension of math problem solving skills (word problems) by a minimum of one year

We are confident we can accomplish these goals in collaboration with you and our students. We commit to providing quality instruction every day. In return, we need your commitment, and that of our students, to be in school, face to face or virtually, on time and ready to learn every single day. The cameras should be on and students need to be **actively** participating. They need to return from lunch and specials at their designated time.

I am asking for your support. We can't continue to move forward and make the necessary improvements without you and the children.

The holidays are quickly approaching. Please look at the flyer in this newsletter titled Holiday Spirit Week. We hope this brings some fun and cheer during our last week before the break.

PREK NEWS

All of our preschool learners are enjoying the cooler weather. We have been discussing clothing and different celebrations and traditions that happen in November and December. We are working on being kind and understanding our differences. We love listening to stories and retelling them in our own words. Don't forget to help us practice counting items like pennies at home.

Kindergarten

This month we are learning about different winter holidays. We are utilizing our knowledge of letter names and sounds to write about the stories we read. We have created a virtual library to allow students to access their leveled readers at home. This month we are learning to describe character feelings and retell stories. In math we are learning about addition. We are learning how to create math problems and solve for missing addends. As always please check canvas for updates and resources. A great resource to utilize at home is i-Ready for both math and reading. *Happy holidays from Kindergarten.*

First Grade

First Grade is chillin' as we work and learn. Our Team is so proud of the students who are making an effort to be successful! We will continue to reinforce the First Grade Standards with rigor.

We are learning about all the different holidays as we study our Multicultural December Events. The children learn tolerance and acceptance of others and to treat each other with kindness no matter which holiday you choose to celebrate.

In Language Arts/Reading we are concentrating on phonemic awareness, fluency and comprehension skills that are worked on daily. Please encourage your child to read daily at home. The more the children practice, the more fluent they will become! Use the Winter Break to reinforce these skills. In addition, we will be completing our second round of individualized BAS/LLI testing by the end of January and hope our children are making progress!

In Math, we are learning about RELATED FACTS and the relationship between addition and subtraction. Practice counting and recognizing numbers up to 120. Reinforce addition and subtraction facts through 20. The

children should be learning them by rote (memory) and you may want to get addition and subtraction flash cards (or magic triangles) to help them.

The second iReady Diagnostic will be given between January 11th – 29th. The children will be assigned in small groups and monitored on camera. It is extremely important to allow your child to take the assessment on their own and no parental assistance should be given. There should be minimal distractions from siblings and noise in the house. Have your child sit with their computer in a quiet place. Please understand that the iReady Diagnostic is not a grade but is used to develop a learning plan based on your child's individual level. This diagnostic is very important to set your child's correct individual pathway.

Fourth Grade

Fourth grade students have been working hard on their Informative writing skills! We are starting the process of writing 4 paragraph essays based on informational articles. The students have been learning how to write a well-planned "evidence table" which is a type of planning sheet and have been learning effective elaboration strategies. Please be on the lookout for your child's writing on TEAMS and at home!

Please practice multiplication and division facts at home.

We hope you have a wonderful holiday season and we are looking forward to all the many exciting activities coming up this year!

Media

Grades K-2:

We finished learning about Fall, Pumpkins, and Apples. We listened to fiction and nonfiction books on these topics. Did you know that pumpkins come in different colors and shapes?

Currently, students are listening to different versions of the Gingerbread Man such as The Gingerbread Cowboy, The Ninjabread Man, The Gingerbread Girl, etc. We are comparing the similarities and differences of these books. The students will discuss our favorite parts of the books. We will also be learning about Winter.

Grades 3-5:

The students completed their research on different states in the United States. We discussed population and how it changes. Also, we compared populations. It was fun to find out that each state has their own flag and map.

Currently, we will be working on a SWAY project, which is similar to Power point, on Native Americans. Each student will get their own tribe to research.

Music

All of our classes have been talking about the different holidays that can be celebrated during the month of December. I have been teaching songs that go with each of the holidays. The students online often will share an instrument while we are having class and we are creating our own concert. Normally, our students would be presenting a Winter Wonderland Concert to celebrate the season. I know our students are missing being able to meet together to practice on our instruments in class. After we return from Winter Break, we will begin studying composers and musicians again.


