GRADE LEVEL NEWS

Preschool

It's a fabulous February here in Peter's Elementary Pre-K and Head Start programs. Our little learners have been in the full swing of all things learning. Every day we practice our ABC's, numbers, shapes, and colors. Our students are excited to learn. Our students are mastering new social and emotional skills through play. The instructional staff keep us safe and model proper behavior. Have you seen our verbal skills in action? Just listen to us talk about our favorite toy, friend, or family member. Every day our students are adding new words to their vocabulary. Self-Control and self-regulating are big concepts that take lots of love and patience. We are a team made up of amazing teachers, paraprofessionals, and support staff. Together, we make a big difference in the lives of our youngest scholars.

First Grade

First Grade is excited about February! We will be learning about treating others with kindness as a part of our February 14th Service Day and about the many African Americans that made contributions to our country for Black History Month. We are excited to see each student's Black History Month project and the creativity they put into it.

In Math we are learning about place value. Take advantage of a trip to the grocery store to see if your student can find the ones and tens place in the prices of items. Making real world connections helps students relate to what they are doing in the classroom. In Reading/Language Arts, the students are learning about technology and how it helps society, writing expository texts, and long vowel sounds. In Science, we are learning about the Earth's surface and the difference between natural and man-made items.

Please check your student's homework journal each day and help them with their homework. Homework is essential to helping your student

practice the skills they learned in the classroom. The First-Grade team thanks you for your support!

Second Grade

We have a recent change in 2nd grade. Ms. Heiss has been promoted from 2nd grade teacher to the Curriculum Support teacher for Grades K-2. We now have a wonderful new addition to the 2nd grade team. Mrs. Monique Hardge has 25 years of teaching experience, and we are very lucky to have her at Peters.

We recently completed all of our second round of testing in ELA, Math and Science. The students did a nice job and overall made great growth in all areas. Continue to have your child work on their reading and math fluency daily. Students should be reading 20 min. a day and working on addition and subtraction.

Reach out to your student's classroom teacher if you have any questions about how they did on their mid-year assessments. We look forward to a wonderful second semester of learning!

Third Grade

Third grade is on a roll! The focus of our lessons throughout February will be Non-Fiction text. In Unit 5, we will be discussing how technology has changed and how it has impacted our lives. We are looking forward to some great discussions on technology. Some standards/concepts we will be covering are learning about text features, supporting details, charts, table of contents, and words in context. We will also continue to work on identifying the problem and solution, making predictions, and retelling the story.

We are now moving on to Topic 8 in Math. Just a friendly reminder, you can access further information on math skill taught by scanning the barcode at the bottom of each math practice sheet.

For Science, we will continue learning about forms of energy. Students will learn about mechanical, light, sound, thermal, and electrical energy. Please take any opportunity to make real life connections with all these forms of energy.

In Social Studies, students will need to submit a Black History Project that will be due at the end of the month. The presentation and information researched will count for two letter grades. A rubric will be provided. Directions will be going home soon.

Fourth Grade

The fourth-grade team would like to wish everyone a Happy New Year! We were excited to wrap up our second quarter of learning. Students working towards earning a bike from the Women's Club of Plantation and the Plantation Police department should continue to work on doing their best in class. Grades in all subject areas and specials, as well as study skills and behavior count. Students are learning about the properties of matter and water in science. Continue to help students study multiplication facts. Being able to fluently recall facts will help students as we move on to multi digit division and multiplying and dividing fractions. We have a field trips coming up in March and April. Be on the lookout for permission slips soon. Be sure to check the agendas every day! As always, the fourth-grade team appreciates your support.

Fifth Grade

The excitement of fifth grade is really increasing knowing that we have several upcoming end of the year events to look forward to. The fifth-grade students are anticipating graduation, the Universal trip, and more. Remember that students must display responsible behavior to take part in these fun events. 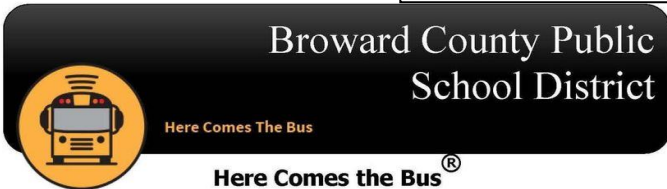

4. Enter your email address, First Name, Last Name and School District Code (87599). Accept the Terms and Conditions, then click "Continue".
5. Press **Confirm** the district displayed is "Broward County Public Schools".
6. Create your password, Repeat your password. Press "Confirm Password" on the screen when complete.
7. If successful, you will be directed to the Thank You screen. At that time, please check your email inbox for an email from parent@synovia.com.
8. Open this email and click the "Activate My Account" link. Once completed, close the browser. You may now open the app and sign in with your email address and newly created password.

Adding a Student:

1. Access the **Here Comes the Bus** app.
2. Click the **Student** icon.
3. Click the **Add Student** button, then enter their last name and Student ID. Click **Submit**.
4. Repeat this process for additional students.

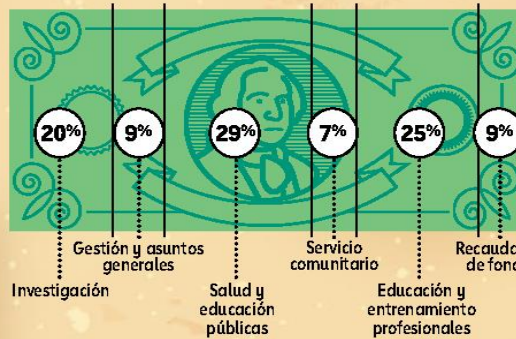
