It is hard to believe we are now in the Third Quarter of the school year. Report Cards for the Second Quarter will be available in Virtual Counselor February 3, 2022. I will also be orienting the report cards and sending them home in an effort to keep you readily informed of your child's academic performance. Interim Reports for the Third Quarter will be available February 11, 2022. I highly encourage you to look at these two documents and schedule a conference with your child's teacher if you have any questions.

We know these are still difficult times, as we are also struggling to keep the school staffed. The updated protocols for COVID-19 can be found at <u>www.browardschools.com/covid</u>. Please communicate with the school as soon as you know when there is a positive case in your home. It allows us the opportunity to disinfect the classroom quickly and try to avoid the spread of COVID or its variants.

Our biggest challenge continues to be consistent attendance. If your child is quarantining at home, they can sign-in to their Canvas page and view teacher led instruction. Should they have questions regarding the work or lesson, they can access ASK-BRIA on Canvas and be assisted by a live tutor. Students with 10 or more days of absences, not related to quarantine, will be contacted by a school staff member and an attendance contract will be formalized. If you have a reassignment seat, please understand that poor attendance may be grounds for rescinding your placement. Peters has a waiting list of families that want to be part of the Panda family via reassignment.

This month we celebrate Black History. The children are learning the great accomplishments and contributions they have made and continue to make. The children have been engaged in many classroom conversations and activities.

GRADE LEVEL NEWS

Pre-Kindergarten

PreK and Head Start classes have been working on reading comprehension activities in developmentally appropriate ways. This includes retelling stories and events with stuffed animals, puppets, and manipulatives (like farm animals). Try

encouraging your child to make up a new ending to a familiar nursery rhyme. For example, Humpty Dumpty got put back together with super glue and saved the day! Let's help make learning fun.

Kindergarten

Hello parents, in kindergarten we are focusing on sight words. We are beginning to use our sight words to write sentences and stories. While reading we are focusing on discussing character feelings and making connections to the stories we read. In math we are working on recognizing addition as putting together. We are learning how to find missing numbers in addition equations. You can always use the weekly homework packets as a way to gauge how your student is doing academically. As always continue to use i-Ready as a way to support your student at home. Thank you for all you do!

First Grade

First grade is excited to start the second semester of the school year! We are currently celebrating Black History Month with our biography project about famous and influential African Americans. In class, we will learn about different African Americans that made significant contributions to our society.

In Math, we are learning about place value and extending the counting sequence. Please continue to practice addition and subtraction facts with your child!

In Science, we are learning about natural materials on the earth's surface and will follow it up with our unit on stars and gravity.

The first-grade Mid-year Reading test is coming up. We are also currently administering our second round of the Benchmark Assessment. Please reinforce decoding of words and practicing sight words. Reading with your child every day for at least 15 minutes will help build their fluency, decoding skills, and vocabulary. After reading, discuss the book to help with their comprehension. As always, the First-Grade team thanks you for your support!

Second Grade

2nd Grade is fired up for February! In ELA we will be discussing characters perspectives, past tense verbs, idioms, and alliteration. In Math we are wrapping up 3-digit addition and subtraction. Then it will be time for money! In Science we finished learning all about the human body. Now we're ready to dig in to soil. In Social Studies we will celebrate Black History month!

Third Grade

All the third graders have been very busy working on multiplication and division strategies and facts. They have learned how multiplication and division are related. Students should focus on memorizing basic facts for the numbers 1-12. We are enjoying practicing reading strategies with our new reading series. In science we have learned about the process of photosynthesis and animal seasonal adaptations. Students are looking forward to the rocket nights and our upcoming African American History project. Be sure to check your child's agenda every day for homework updates. As always thank you for your continued support.

Fourth Grade

We are incredibly excited to start our Black History Month projects. Students will explore Black artists, activists, musicians, doctors, lawyers, scientists, politicians, etc., create a research project that reflects their iconic figures childhood, challenges, triumphs, accomplishments, and the impact he/she has had on our world. Students across the grade level will be presenting their Black History Month Projects for their peers.

February is a month of love; a time to reflect on how we treat ourselves and others. On 2/14 we will be taking time to understand each other and appreciate each other's differences and strengths.

In Social Studies, students will develop a travel brochure to attract visitors to one of Florida's state or national parks, cities, regions, barrier islands, or historical destinations. Students will gather information and ideas for this brochure textbooks, personal visits, travel



agencies, libraries, or internet research. This is a fun activity for your child to do as they learn about Florida.

In writing, 4th grade students are conducting an informative essay on "How Invasive Species are Effecting Floridians." Students will read four sources, create an "Evidence Table," cite text evidence, elaborate on their thinking, and use the writing process to publish a four-paragraph essay.

We are encouraging students to read for 30 or more minutes a night. Be sure to have your child respond to the text before, during, and after reading. Also, please have your child practice their multiplication and division facts daily to help support our learning with fractions.

Fifth Grade

Our fifth-grade students are showing amazing learning gains since the school year started. It is hard to believe they will be middle school students in such a short period of time.

In Math we are working on fractions, and we are always practicing our basic multiplication and division facts. Take just five minutes a day to quiz your student on their math facts to improve fluency.

In ELA we have been practicing our writing skills and working on Informative and Opinion essays. Ask your child how they plan and write their essay. It is wonderful to see what talented writers we have here at Peters!

Our Single Point of Entry doorbell has been installed and is currently in use. STARTING


