PRESCHOOL

Our Head Start and Prekindergarten classes have been working hard on social skills and solving our problems using words. During the next month, we will look at special things that families do to celebrate. Many of us wear special clothes or have traditions for the holidays we observe. Clothing can lead to discussion on texture. Try bringing out old baby clothes and comparing the sizes with current clothes. You could show your child pictures of themselves as a baby. Talk about why the clothes do not fit anymore. All living things grow and change. We are just beginning to learn about sizes and growth. Clothes can help make this abstract concept more concrete. We look forward to a fabulous new year!

KINDERGARTEN

Math: In Kindergarten we are exploring addition. Students are learning a variety of ways to show how to add two numbers together. They are practicing addition using a number line, counting on, and creating equations using information given to them through pictures, or presented to them in a word problem. They are learning the ways to make 10 and use patterns to add. In math centers, they are reinforcing these skills with the use of manipulatives such as cubes and counters to visualize how to represent the sum of two numbers.

ELA: Our writing is focused on expository text through write and draw activities. Students continue to engage in activities that strengthen their phonological and phonemic awareness skills. Letter recognition, letter sounds, high frequency words, rhyming, segmenting words into onset-rime, and blending phonemes are part of our daily routine during our ELA block. Our literacy centers offer activities to reinforce those skills. In small groups, we use our decodable readers and phonics games to improve fluency.

Science: Students are learning how to sort and compare objects by observable properties, such as size, weight (heavy or light), shape, color, temperature (hot or cold), and texture.

Social Studies: Students are learning about civics and government, rules at home and school, and holidays and traditions.

Thank you for continuing to work with your children at home. Completing homework assignments each week reinforces all the skills we are working on in our classrooms. We appreciate your support!




First grade is excited for the Holiday Season! We will learn about all the different holidays as we study Multicultural Holiday Events. The children learn tolerance and acceptance of others and to treat each other with kindness no matter which holiday you choose to celebrate.

In Language Arts/Reading, we are concentrating on phonemic awareness, fluency and comprehension skills that are worked on daily. Please encourage your child to read daily at home. The more the children practice, the more fluent they will become.



In Math, we will begin learning about how to collect, represent, and interpret data. Please continue to practice both addition and subtraction facts at home to help reinforce these skills.

Please remember to check the homework journals and folders daily. First grade thanks you for your support with your student's education!



THIRD GRADE

Currently, we are in high gear in third grade! We will continue working on Unit 3 Government for the People. Students are learning about the branches of government and the importance of having their voices heard. They had the opportunity to vote for our school President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. It was a great way to show them the importance of voting. At the end of this Unit, students will be creating a poster. These projects are always super exciting since students get to display what they have learned. We are wrapping up Topic 4 in Math. Our next Topic we will be working on quadrilaterals, area, and perimeter. Please continue working on multiplication fluency since we will continue applying multiplication concepts in this unit as well.

SECOND GRADE

Second grade has been very busy learning their twodigit addition facts to 100. We are learning about Expository and Opinion Writing as well. Students are practicing writing three paragraph essays on a topic. In reading, we are working on Central Idea and Relevant Details. Students are working hard to go back in their text to find their answers and to use other strategies to increase their comprehension skills. Our focus for Social Studies in December is Government. We will be learning all about the three branches of government, rules and laws, and who enforces them.

Our Second Grade DHH class has an exciting field trip to see Signing Santa. In Science we are starting the Human Body. Students will create a project with all the major organs and learn what their function is. Please have students work on addition and subtraction facts and read daily! We hope that everyone has a safe holiday season!



It is very beneficial for children to discuss what they are learning in school. Take a moment to discuss with your child what they are learning in the different subjects. Ask them to share their predictions, connections, or a summary of what they are reading or learning. Having these meaningful conversations helps students reflect on their day.



November was a short but busy month. We have been learning about the role of government in our communities. We also selected our classroom representatives for student council. We have been learning about animal adaptations and matter in science. Continue to help students study multiplication facts. Being able to fluently recall facts will help students as we move on to multi digit division and multiplying and dividing fractions. Be sure to check their agendas every day! As always, the fourth-grade team appreciates your support!

🟉 FIFTH GRADE

We cannot believe that our fifth-grade students are almost halfway through their last year at Peters!

In ELA, we are working on our writing skills and improving on what we learned last year with essay writing. This is a talent that will be helpful in high school, college, and beyond. Make sure to ask your child to share what they have been writing in class. We are continuously improving all our Reading skills. Talk to your child about what books they are reading.

In Math, the students are hard at work with decimals. Please help practice basic multiplication and division facts at home. These skills are building blocks for more complex problems.

The fifth-grade team is here for you. Please reach out to your child's teacher with any questions or concerns. We appreciate you checking Canvas and Pinnacle regularly to stay informed of your child's progress. There must be a team effort amongst parents, students, and teachers in order to ensure that our students receive the world class education that they deserve. We want to ensure that all of our students are ready for middle school next year!


