#### Information from Margate Resource Officer Lombardo: Rules and Laws for Handicapped Parking Spaces

- Handicapped parking makes life in Florida a little less challenging for those who already face daily challenges
  in life. To prevent individuals from taking advantage of these opportunities for the disabled Florida has
  handicapped parking laws that are dictated by the Florida legislature.
- Florida state statute 316.1955 "Enforcement of parking requirements for persons who have disabilities" states: "It is unlawful for any person to stop, stand, or park a vehicle within, any such specially designated and marked parking space provided in accordance with s. 553.5041, unless such vehicle displays a parking permit issued under s. 316.1958 or s. 320.0848, or license plate issued under..."
- Florida state statue 316.1959 "Handicapped parking enforcement" states: "The provisions of handicapped parking shall be enforced by state, county, and municipal authorities in their respective jurisdictions whether on public or private property in the same manner as it is used to enforce other parking laws and ordinances by said agencies." If you illegally stop, stand, or park in a handicapped parking space you can be fined up to \$250.00. If you use the permit of a disabled friend, relative, or acquaintance you can be fined up to \$500.00 or receive six months of jail time. Please be courteous of others. Do not stop, stand, or park in a handicapped parking spot unless you have a permit for your vehicle, and remember to display your permit in a visible location.
