2016-17 ANNUAL TITLE I SCHOOLS PARENT ENGAGEMENT SURVEY RESULTS

#### Introduction

The 2016-17 Annual Parent Engagement Survey was provided by the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) to determine parent's level of satisfaction with engagement activities at Title I schools. The administration window for the survey spanned from March 6<sup>th</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017. Four methods were employed to provide as many opportunities as possible for parents to give feedback. These methods were: an e-mail via survey monkey; a link on the school websites; laptop stations at school based meetings; and paper based surveys that were handed-out and collected at the school level.

Overall, there were 24,091 surveys returned via the four methods listed above. Analyses could not be conducted for 4,983 surveys because of discrepancies with the data: 1. parents did not enter a response 2. student and school information were missing. Thus, 19,108 parent responses were utilized for the current examination.

At your school, 82 parents provided feedback. Via e-mail, 95% (78) parent responses. Through the public link, 5% (4) provided feedback. 0% (0) of your parents' responses were shared via paper and manually uploaded. Finally, 0% (0) of the surveys were completed during school based meetings. As of April 3<sup>rd</sup>, there were 702 students enrolled at Miramar Elementary.

*Note*. SurveyMonkey merged "I never received the information" and "Not Applicable" responses. Therefore, data for these categories could not be disseminated separately. Also, due to rounding percentages may not add up to 100% (i.e. totals may range from 99.9% to 102%).
