Five Tips Toward a More Positive Attitude

- 1. Kids model their parents' behavior. If they see you bouncing back from setbacks, they'll learn to do the same.
- 2. Help them see a way around obstacles. When something doesn't work out as planned, encourage them to brainstorm other ways to approach the problem or to reach their goal.
- 3. Let them know that negative reactions are okay when it's appropriate. Having a positive attitude doesn't mean burying legitimate feelings, but acknowledging them, and then finding a way to move on.
- 4. Teach constructive reframing. If a child declares she's lousy at sports, suggest that she simply needs more practice and that if excelling at sports is important to her, she'll eventually master the necessary skills.
- 5. Encourage positive self-talk. Words have power, so offer a few affirmations they can repeat until they become second nature.

Pre-School

In school this month we will be learning about the importance of staying healthy. We will learn about healthy foods and why exercise is good for us. Kindergarten

This month in kindergarten, we will focus on the many story's writers tell. In math, we are learning to add number to 10. In science, we are learning about physical changes in materials. In social studies, we are learning to compare long ago and now. We are celebrating many different cultural holidays this month and our teachers are teaching us about them. Can't wait to share more with you next month.

First Grade

Our 1st graders are flying high and making good progress! 1st graders just enjoyed their Thanksgiving break and are now ready to rock the month of December! In our Reading Benchmark series, we are learning about how we can be great community members and how we can take care of our earth. We are reading a lot of fantastic nonfiction passages as we learn about this. We are using text features including titles, headings, captions, graphs, maps, glossaries, and illustrations to assist us in understanding of texts. In math, we are learning about collecting, representing, and interpreting data using pictographs and tally marks. In writing, we are learning about expository writing. In Science we are learning about water safety. In Social Studies we are learning about important figures in history and how they contributed to our society. 1st grade will be participating in Multicultural Night on December 14 and representing countries from South America. Please continue to read for 20 minutes every night with your child, practice sight words, and complete homework as this reflects what we are learning in class! We would like to end December with a pajama party and winter activities to take us into Winter Vacation! More details to come! Thank you for all of your help and support!

Second Grade

Second graders are continuing to work on becoming amazing readers! Our Soaring Eagles will work on identifying the topic and relevant details in a text. Also, we will be learning to use text features to demonstrate understanding of texts. Our students will be writing expository pieces about a given topic and learning that history tells the story of people and events of other times and places in social studies. In math, they will continue to learn double-digit addition and subtraction and determining the operation (+ -) in a word problem. Finally, our amazing second graders will be learning about the various systems and functions of the human body. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year from Meadowbrook!

Third Grade

Winter break is right around the corner! Third graders have been very busy. In reading we are explaining different characters' perspectives in literary texts. We are also identifying and explaining figurative language in texts. In math, we are busy learning about place value and ordering and comparing numbers. Lastly, in science we are keeping warm by learning about the different types of energy, motion, and friction. Please continue to remind your child to read every single night and continue to practice their multiplication facts.

Fourth Grade

In ELA, we will be learning how setting, events, conflict and character development contribute to the plot in a literary text, explain how relevant details support the central idea and summarize a text to enhance comprehension. In addition, students are learning to explain how rhyme and structure create meaning to a poem and write an expository text about a text, using multiple sources, elaboration, and organization. In Math, we are learning different strategies for dividing numbers. We will be learning how to solve real world multi-step word problems in the coming weeks. In Science, we are learning about the rotation and evolution of Earth. We will be learning about the phases of the moon. We are excited to be planning our end of the year field trip to Islands of Adventure.

In math 5th graders are learning to division with decimals and represent patterns and data on the coordinate plane. During the upcoming weeks, ask your children to share with you all about the Water Cycle they are becoming experts on that topic. With the winter holiday break closing schools for more that two weeks, some families and students might struggle with adjusting to a significant change in their routines. Here are some practical suggestions to help make the two weeks without school easier and happier for all the members of your family (adapted from www.pulse.seattlechildrens.org):

- · Prioritize sleeping and eating: Maintaining a regular sleeping and eating schedule during these less-structured days can help reduce stress and improve overall well-being.
- Develop a plan for screen time and create family screen time activities: www.commonsensemedia.org provides guidelines for managing screentime for children. Family screen time can be a fun way for parents and children to watch a holiday classic, such as "A Charlie Brown Christmas" or "Rudolph the Red Nose Reindeer", or another holiday-themed movie.


