Five Tips Toward a More Positive Attitude

- 1. Kids model their parents' behavior. If they see you bouncing back from setbacks, they'll learn to do the same.
- 2. Help them see a way around obstacles. When something doesn't work out as planned, encourage them to brainstorm other ways to approach the problem or to reach their goal.
- 3. Let them know that negative reactions are okay when it's appropriate. Having a positive attitude doesn't mean burying legitimate feelings, but acknowledging them, and then finding a way to move on.
- 4. Teach constructive reframing. If a child declares she's lousy at sports, suggest that she simply needs more practice and that if excelling at sports is important to her, she'll eventually master the necessary skills.
- 5. Encourage positive self-talk. Words have power, so offer a few affirmations they can repeat until they become second nature.

Who's ready for middle school? Our 5th grade students will be completing registration forms and selecting their courses for middle school during the month of February. Parents, please complete the registration form and provide your 5th grader with copies of required proofs of residence (for example, light bill, driver's license, lease, or mortgage statement) in time for our visit from New River Middle. Also, please discuss your child's choices of elective classes (that's what they call "specials" in middle school!) and take some time to become familiar with the wonderful programs at New River Middle School. The CogAT (Cognitive Abilities Test) will be offered to 2nd grade students on March 7th, 8th, and 9th. Pre-School

In February, the preschool classes were busy making patterns with Valentine colors (red, white and pink). We are learning that Valentine's Day is a time to show affection to family and friends by sending and receiving cards, gifts and flowers. Also, love and friendship can be expressed in many ways. Examples are sharing, helping and talking or playing with each other in kind ways. Parents talk with your child about the ways people in your family are kind to one another.

Second Grade

Second graders are working towards mastery of their addition and subtraction facts. Please encourage your child to work on Reflex Math if there is a computer available at home, as this is an excellent program that will guide them through the fluency standards. In Reading, students are reading non-fiction texts and paying close attention to captions, headings, photos, maps, and other graphic features to gain a deeper understanding of the information. Please encourage your child to check out a book from the library or borrow one from class. Reading at home makes all the difference in the world!

Kindergarten

This month in kindergarten, we will focus on technology at home and at school. In math, we are learning addition and subtraction 0 to 10. In science, we are learning about the five senses. In social studies, we are learning about long ago and today. Can't wait to share more with you next month.

Third Grade

Happy February! We love learning in 3rd grade. In reading we are learning how text features contribute to meaning and identify the text structures of chronology, comparison, and cause/effect in texts. In math we are learning how to add and subtract multi-digit whole numbers including using a standard algorithm. In science, we are investigating, observing, and explaining that heat is produced when one object rubs against another. Help us at home by reminding students to read 20 minutes a day. Students can also practice their math fluency at home using reflex math which is located in clever.

First Grade

This month "Our Soaring Eagles" in grade 1 continue working with Benchmark Advance Unit 5. They will identify the topic of and relevant details in a text, use topic and important details for an informational text and identify and describe the main story elements in a story. Students will produce an informational writing piece for classroom bulletin board. During our math block we will start Topic 9 "Plot, Order and Compare Two-Digit Numbers." In science the student is expected to investigate how magnifiers make things appear bigger and how they help people see things that they could not have seen without them. In Social Studies-Black History Month. February 14, 2023, is Early Release Day and A Day of Service & Love. February 24th, 2023, is our Field trip to the Museum of Discovery and Science

Fourth Grade

In Reading, we will be wrapping up Benchmark Unit 5, where we have been learning about text features, text structuresproblem/solution, sequence, and description and how they help us understand the central message of the text. In writing, we are learning about how to write and make a claim or state our perspective, with logical reasons, using evidence from multiple sources, while elaborating, and organizing in a text structure using transitional words. In Math, we are finishing working on factors. We will be working on fractions in the upcoming weeks. In Science, we are completing the law of conservation of mass and moving into magnets.

Fifth Grade

In 5th grade, our eagles are working on describing how an author develops characters' perspectives; analyzing how settings, events, conflict, and characterization contribute to plot; explaining the development of themes; analyzing how figurative language and other poetic elements work together; and summarizing literary texts. With their writing, our eagles are learning how to plan for and respond to narrative prompts. In science, they are learning about and investigating the flow of electricity that requires a closed circuit and identifying and classifying materials that conduct electricity and materials that do not. Finally, in math, they are learning how to add and subtract fractions with unlike denominators, including mixed numbers and fractions greater than 1, with procedural reliability.

Media

In the Media Center we are recognizing the achievements of African Americans for Black History Month. We will continue to work on story elements, themes, and biographies. Remind students to continue using Beanstack to record all books that they have read.

ART

Hello parents! Kindergarten is finishing their Mosaic and will then be creating their own butterfly for the Holocaust Memorial using watercolors! 4th grade is creating lots of patterns with their tessellation shapes, 5th grade will be beginning something brand new for the school. They will be creating their own tile to be permanently placed on the wall!!


For February, we will be celebrating the great contributions of African American Musicians from the roots of the Blues and Jazz, all the way to modern Hip-Hop.
