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# WHAT WE LEARN IN CLASS?

### Prekindergarten

### Kindergarten

### lst Grade



February is Black History month and the month of love. We are spreading love throughout the entire month. This month in First Grade, we are going to talk, read and write about how technology can make a difference in our lives. In math, we are learning to identify the number that is one more, one less, ten more and ten less than a given twodigit number. Plot, order and compare whole numbers up to 100. In science, we are learning about fast and slow changes to land. In social studies, we are learning about presidents. Presidents Day will be February 17. We will also be planting our baby palm trees around the school in honor of Stoneman Douglas. Please make it a daily routine to read with your child for 20 minutes each night, practice sight words and skill words, and complete homework assignments, as these activities align with what we are learning in class. ### Grade Znd

Greeting to all second-grade families. In ELA, we will explore how to Retell and Describe Main story Elements. We will Identify and Explain Theme and work on Recognizing Different Character Perspectives. We will also look at Alliteration. In Math, we are finishing up Topic 9 working with Time and Money. We will look at Topic 10 next, which will focus on Place Value with numbers to 1 to 1,000. In Science, we will complete the unit on Rocks and Soil. Up next, Patterns in

Nature where we will look at Weather Patterns. In Social Studies, we are continuing with Unit 6 which looks at Immigration

Over Time and how they influence America over time. Get ready for a fun and educational day. Second grade is also going on a FREE

field trip to the Museum of Discovery and Science February 19. Thank you for supporting your child's success by reading with your child daily, practicing basic facts, and ensuring that their homework is complete. Thank you again for all your support!

In ELA, we're moving into Unit 5 of Benchmark, where we'll focus on analyzing an author's claim or perspective. 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




