Five Tips Toward a More Positive Attitude

- 1. Kids model their parents' behavior. If they see you bouncing back from setbacks, they'll learn to do the same.
- 2. Help them see a way around obstacles. When something doesn't work out as planned, encourage them to brainstorm other ways to approach the problem or to reach their goal.
- 3. Let them know that negative reactions are okay when it's appropriate. Having a positive attitude doesn't mean burying legitimate feelings, but acknowledging them, and then finding a way to move on.
- 4. Teach constructive reframing. If a child declares she's lousy at sports, suggest that she simply needs more practice and that if excelling at sports is important to her, she'll eventually master the necessary skills.
- 5. Encourage positive self-talk. Words have power, so offer a few affirmations they can repeat until they become second nature.

Pre-School

The preschool classes are learning all about the winter season. We are discussing the types of clothing that are appropriate for cold weather and made delicious hot chocolate. We are also learning about animals that live in very cold weather such as polar bears and penguins. Parents, please remember to read to your child every night.

Second Grade

Happy 2023 from second grade! We are happy to be back in school. Second graders have taken a FAST state assessment in reading and math. This assessment shows us the skills and standards to practice. Please contact your child's teacher for the test results.

Second graders have been learning about the human body and how the different body systems work together to keep us healthy. We are also beginning volume 2 in math where we study fractional concepts, money, geometry, and time.

Kindergarten

This month in kindergarten we will focus on technology at home and in school. In math, we are learning addition and subtraction from 0 to 10. In science, we are learning about the five senses. In social studies, we are learning about long ago and today. We wish you a very happy New Year. We can't wait to share more with you next month.

Third Grade

Happy New Year Eagles! Third graders are working towards mastery of their multiplication and division facts. Please encourage your child to work on Reflex Math if there is a computer available at home as this is an excellent program that will guide them through these standards. In Reading, students are identifying text structures and explaining how text features contribute to meaning. In Science, we are describing and identifying the different states of water.

First Grade

Winter break was great! Now we are back in school, ready to continue to learn! This month we will learn to explain who is telling the story, identify and explain the moral of the story, and identify and describe the main story elements. In math, we are focusing on understanding place value, we will learn to compose and decompose two-digit numbers in multiple ways using tens and ones. We will also, learn to read numbers from 0 to 100 written in standard form, expanded form and word form. In science, we will learn and investigate how magnifiers make things appear bigger and help people see things they could not see without them. In social studies, we will learn how to compare life now with life in the past, identify celebrations and national holidays as a way of remembering and honoring the heroism and achievements of the people, events, and our nation's ethnic heritage. In addition, we will learn about timelines and create one using primary sources. Please continue to encourage your child to read every night for at least 20 <u>comprehension</u> improve their fluency and

Fourth Grade

Welcome Back Eagles! This month in ELA, students will be wrapping up Unit 4 which focuses on identifying and explaining the difference between a narrator's point of view and character perspective. Next week, we will be working on Unit 5, which focuses on being able to explain an author's claims, reasons and evidence to support a claim. In writing, our eagles will continue to practice writing an opinion essay using evidence from the text to support their claim. In Math, we are wrapping up Topic 6 which focuses on true/false equations, unknown numbers, and multi-step problems. We will be working on factors and divisibility in the upcoming weeks. We are preparing to take our Cumulative Assessment on Topics #1-7 the week of January

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Fifth Grade

This month our 5th graders are drawing build inferences to knowledge about technology. They are also building vocabulary utilizing context clues and writing wonderful opinion essays. In Science, we will continue learning about energy and transformation of energy. In Math, we will add and subtract fractions with unlike denominators.

The intermediate grade levels are working on the central idea as it relates to informational text and the theme of a story. Music


This month at Meadowbrook, we will be starting our afterschool strings and theater clubs. Please sign up with Mr. Alfano in the music room.
