Transportation Changes

Please note, that due to security reasons, changes to your child's transportation status cannot be delivered via telephone. Drop off

Pre-School

The preschool classes are learning all about the winter season. We are discussing the types of clothing that are appropriate for cold weather and made delicious hot chocolate. We are also learning about animals that live in very cold weather such as polar bears and penguins. Parents, please remember to read to your child every night.

Kindergarten

In kindergarten, we are working on family words, beginning, and ending sounds. We are learning to retell stories, poems, and songs by using details such as characters, setting and the events. In math, we are learning subtraction. In science we are learning the five senses and for social studies, our teacher will be teaching us more about residents' day. Can't wait to share more with you next month.

First Grade

Happy New Year to our Soaring Eagles!

This month we will be learning about how stories teach us a lesson and how we can learn from our mistakes. In Math, we are working on counting by 1's, 5's and 10's to 120. For science, students will recognize that water, rocks, soil, and living organisms are found on Earth's surface and magnifiers. For Social Studies, we will be able to identify celebrations and national holidays as a way of remembering and honoring the heroism and achievements of the people, events, and our nation's ethnic heritage. We can't wait to see all the greatness our Eagles bring to 2022!

Second Grade

Hello 2nd Grade Parents,

The second graders have been busy this month. We have been practicing our sight words, reading at home, and learning how to add and subtract double-digit numbers. We are regrouping while adding and subtracting (75 + 37, 93-29, 95 + 39 + 25 + 99). Please have your child use Reflex Math or flash cards at home to reinforce basic addition and subtraction facts. The second graders will be taking the Primary Mid-Year Test on February 8 and 9. Teachers will be sending home information regarding the test.

Third Grade

Watch what we do in 2022! Third graders are working toward mastery of their multiplication and division facts. Please encourage your child to work on Reflex Math if there is a computer available at home as this is an excellent program that will guide them through these standards. We will also begin Fractions and Geometry this month. During Reading, our students are comparing their point of view to that of the author, connecting historical events or scientific ideas using sequencing, and cause, and effect, and comparing and contrasting two different stories by the same author about similar characters. THIRD GRADE ROCKS....THIRD GRADE RULES!!

Fourth Grade

This month ELA is focusing on text structures within informational text types (Historical-Scientific-Technical). We are also focusing on how to identify the author's claim and supporting evidence within informational text. In Math, we are learning to generate equivalent fractions and how to compare fractions with different numerators and denominators. We will begin adding, subtracting, and multiplying fractions in the upcoming weeks. 4th grade will be attending our 1st off campus trip to the Museum of Discovery & Science at the end of the month. Please continue to encourage your child to work on I-Ready and Reflex Math daily at home.


Fifth Grade


ART
