WHAT WE LEARN IN CLASS?

Prekindergarten

The preschool classes are learning all about science and what it is. We are learning to identify, sort, and describe shapes and explore ways that objects change. Parents try these activities at home. Help your child understand change by doing simple experiments. Heat water to show how it turns to steam. Freeze water to show how water turns to ice. Talk about how the three forms of water look and move.

Kindergarten

This month in kindergarten, we are focusing on why we celebrate people and events. In math, we are learning numbers up to 100. In science, we are exploring objects in the sky, and in social studies, we are learning about geography. I can't wait to share more with you next month!

lst Grade

What a busy month it has been! As we enter March, we are focusing on becoming fluent readers, which means we need to blend smoothly and read quickly, while understanding what we are reading. In addition, we are expanding our sight word vocabulary (words that cannot be read by sounds but have to be recognized by sight.) This will help us to read groups of words together more efficiently to get the meaning. One way you can help at home is by listening to your child read to you EVERY NIGHT. This includes passages and books that are sent home for homework, reviewing the Writing books that are sent home at the end of practicing their sight word lists. In math we will be studying telling time to the hour and half hour, counting coins and currency, and will begin the study of geometry. In addition, we are working on memorizing our math facts within twenty. In Science, we are beginning our study of fliving and nonliving things. We will learn the characteristics and sort things into the two categories. Our recent field trip to Flamingo Gardens was an excellent introduction to living things as we observed many plants and animals and learned interesting facts about them. Thank you for all you do to help your students achieve each new goal. We couldn't do it without you!



2nd Grade

Greetings to all second-grade families. In ELA, we will Identify Central Idea and relevant details, explain how text features contribute to meaning and, we will also identify and explain similes. In Math, we are finishing up Topic 11 "Three-digit addition and subtraction". We will look at Topic 12 next, which will focus on Measuring length. In Science, our students will learn more about Air. Up next, Severe weather. In Social Studies, we are continuing with Unit which looks at how the government works, and we will start out Unit 8 about Citizens. Thank you for supporting your child's success by reading with your child daily, practicing basic facts, and ensuring that their homework is complete. Thank you again for all your support!

3rd Grade

Thank you for all that you do to better the education of your children! This month, we are working heavily on fractions in math. If there is an opportunity to talk about fractions at home, please take it! Also, keep practicing multiplication facts. In reading, we are in nonfiction texts focusing on author's purpose and author's claim. Please be sure that students are reading thirty minutes every night and completing reading and math homework. Thank you!

5th Grade

Welcome to our March Newsletter! It is time to rejuvenate and bloom as we continue to educate our wonderful students!

educate our wonderful students! In Reading/ELA, we are wrapping up Unit 6 and soon to start Unit 7 "Conflicts That Shaped a Nation" and explore the connections of a conflict that shapes society. They will read and synthesize firsthand accounts of informational texts and historical fiction, particularly about the American Revolution. These themes align with our **Social Studies** curriculum. In Math, we are currently working on Topic 11. Topic 11 focuses on classifying figures, developing understanding of the measurable attribute of volume, and using numbers and operations to compute the volume of rectangular prisms and composite shapes. In Science related the predicted the topic for determine the start for the prism.

Science, students will be working on the topic of weather. Students will recognize how air temperature, barometric pressure, humidity, wind speed and direction, and precipitation determine the weather in a particular place and time. Students will also be working on

weather in specific environments. This topic focuses on the characteristics (temperature and precipitation) of different climate zones as related to latitude, elevation, and proximity

to water. We would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to all our amazing volunteers who made the JA BizTown visit a tremendous success! Your support is invaluable as we prepare our students for their journeys into financial literacy, helping them become better citizens and money managers. Thank you for your dedication and involvement! March is packed with many learning opportunities! In ELA, students will continue working in Unit 6 of Benchmark. In this unit, students will be able to identify different fictional genres where character(s) face challenges and overcome obstacles. In addition, students will be learning about theme and how to identify details to support a theme, while also being able to identify characters, settings, and events and how they contribute to the plot of a story. This unit for writing,

students will continue practicing writing an argumentative essay, being sure to incorporate a claim with reasons, evidence, examples, and elaboration. In Math, students are working on fractions and converting them to decimals. In Science, students are learning

about the Phases of the Moon.
