Our students will be participating in end-of-year testing throughout May. These assessments are crucial in understanding their progress and areas for improvement. Here are some tips to help your child prepare:


- Ensure Adequate Sleep: A well-rested mind performs better. Make sure your child gets at least 8-10 hours of sleep each night.

#### WHAT WE LEARN IN CLASS?

#### Prekindergarten

The preschool classes are learning how technology changes our lives. We are learning how the size of groups changes when we take objects away. The letter People from A-Z are visiting and we are reviewing their letters and sounds. Here is an activity you can try at home to support your child's learning at school. At meals, take turns telling subtraction, or take-away, stories with your child. For example: "I had three green beans. I ate three. How many are left?"

#### Kindergarten

This month in kindergarten, we are focusing on why we make choices. In math, we are learning to identify, compare, and compose two-dimensional (3-D) figures. In science, we are exploring the characteristics of plants and animals through literature, and in social studies, we are learning about geography. I can't wait to share more with you next month!

#### Ist Grade

May came so quick! We can't believe we are in our last full month of the school year. Students just finished their Reading and Math FAST tests, but there is still plenty more to do and learn! In Benchmark, we are learning about and reading stories all about observing the sky. We are learning about vowel sounds with ar, or, ur and ir. In math we are learning about fractions. We are also practicing our math fluency with addition and subtraction. In Science we are learning about having inherited traits. In Social Studies, we are learning about the Holocaust and we will being learning about Memorial Day and have some fun activities along with it. Students will be taking their Math and Reading Diagnostic test in May. Students will also be taking their end of the year Science test. We have some fun events coming up in May. May 23, students will participate in Field Day. This is a fun day outside, filled with games and activities. June 2 will be the school talent show! June 3 will be the last day of school for students. Please read over the summer with your child. Your children have grown so much this year and we are proud of them!



#### 2nd Grade

Our 2nd graders have been making great strides, and we are so proud of their hard work and enthusiasm. In ELA, we are about to begin a new unit —Unit 9: Buyers and Sellers—which focuses on: Suffixes -y and -ly, Explaining how text features contribute to meaning, Identifying plot structure and describing main story elements, Identifying different characters' perspectives, Identifying rhyme schemes in poems, Retelling informational texts using central ideas and relevant details. In Math, we will focus on Topic 14, which covers collecting and representing data. In Science, students will deepen their understanding of severe weather before moving on to explore distinguishing body parts. In Social Studies, we will complete Topic 9 on Economics. Stay tuned for important updates, upcoming events, and opportunities to stay involved. We're excited for another fantastic month of learning together!

#### 3rd Grade

Hello families! We are getting closer and closer to the FAST! Please make sure students complete their reading and math homework every single day. They should also be practicing multiplication facts daily. This test is very serious, so please be sure that students are in school every day leading up to it, get a lot of rest, and eat healthy breakfasts each morning. Let's rock this test!

#### 4th Grade

4th graders are shaking things up as we dig into a brand-new reading unit all about Earth's Changes—think earthquakes, volcanoes, and wild weather! We're exploring the big question: "How do Earth's natural processes impact our lives?" Students will compare different accounts of the same event, summarize key details, analyze text features, and explore how authors share their perspectives through their writing. Plus, we're kicking off FAST Test Review to get ready for the big day on May 15! We'll be practicing strategies and reviewing everything we've learned this year. Students are wrapping up their unit on Angles, Area, and Perimeter. Next, we'll be diving into our final topic of the year: Measurement. After that, we'll begin a comprehensive review of everything we've learned this year to prepare for the FAST assessment on May 21st. Your continued support at home with review and practice is greatly appreciated!

#### 5th Grade

Welcome to our May **Newsletter!** We are in our Testing Era... In Reading/ELA and Social Studies, we are in our next unit of study, "Water: Fact and Fiction." Unit eight in the Benchmark Advance Program is all about water and what it means to people in different societies. This unit explores the significance of water, highlighting its importance in ancient myths and legends, as well as its essential role as a vital resource for us. Students will explore Greek myths, read interviews, tall tales, and informational texts.

In Math, we are currently working on the Topic Multi-Step Problems Involving Measurement Conversions—Topic 14. Students use relationships between units to convert from one customary unit to another.

In Science, students are working on environmental changes

May is Mental Health Awareness Month, a time to raise awareness about mental health and the millions of people who are affected by mental illness.


