Five Tips Toward a More Positive Attitude

- 1. Kids model their parents' behavior. If they see you bouncing back from setbacks, they'll learn to do the same.
- 2. Help them see a way around obstacles. When something doesn't work out as planned, encourage them to brainstorm other ways to approach the problem or to reach their goal.
- 3. Let them know that negative reactions are okay when it's appropriate. Having a positive attitude doesn't mean burying legitimate feelings, but acknowledging them, and then finding a way to move on.
- 4. Teach constructive reframing. If a child declares she's lousy at sports, suggest that she simply needs more practice and that if excelling at sports *is important to her*, she'll eventually master the necessary skills.
- 5. Encourage positive self-talk. Words have power, so offer a few affirmations they can repeat until they become second nature.

Pre-School

Fall is here! It's the perfect time to continue practicing reading and comprehension. Pumpkins, weather, and the color of trees are great topics you can discuss with your student this month! It's also a great time to continue practicing multiplication facts. In Math we will be learning how to divide using multiplication strategies. In science, we are exploring plant structures and functions. We are also celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month and are learning about all the influential individuals of Hispanic background. Happy October!

Kindergarten

This month in kindergarten, we will focus on rules. In math, we are collecting and sorting objects into categories and comparing the categories by counting the objects in each category. In science, we are sorting objects by observable properties, such as size, shape, color, temperature (hot or cold), weight (heavy or light) and texture In social studies, we are learning to make good decisions. We are celebrating thanksgiving this month and our teachers are teaching us about this holiday. Can't wait to share more with you next month.

First Grade

Welcome to November! First grade just completed a wonderful field trip to Parker Playhouse to see the interactive play "Havana Hop," where a young girl told her story of her passion and fused it with culture and family history. We are continuing to work on becoming amazing readers! In reading, our Soaring Eagles will work really hard this month learning to identify the topic and relevant details in a text. Also, we will be learning to use text features to demonstrate understanding of texts. Our students will be writing expository pieces about a given topic and learning that history tells the story of people and events of other times and places in social studies. In math, they will continue to develop an understanding of the relationship between addition and subtraction, and in science they will be learning that all plants and animals, including humans, have basic needs such as air, water, food, and space. Please continue to read to your child, as well as letting your child read to you for a combined 20 minutes per night. Thanks for all the support as we watch our First Grade Eagles Rise Together!

Second Grade

Second-grade students are currently working on retelling stories and identifying story elements, as well as continuing with writing opinion pieces based on texts they have read. In math we are working with addition and subtraction using 2digit numbers with regrouping. We are learning many strategies for adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers such as partial sums, compensation, and the traditional algorithm. In Science we are learning about daily weather and even SEVERE weather like tornadoes, hurricanes, blizzards, and droughts! Please continue to read to your child, as well as letting your child read to you for a combined 30 minutes per night. Thanks for all the support as we watch your child learn

Third Grade

GOBBLE, GOBBLE Third Grade Parents! We are filling our brains with as much knowledge as a full plate of Thanksgiving Dinner! In Reading we are learning about cause and effect as well as text features. We are also learning about the government and how to be a good citizen. In Math we are working on all things geometry. In Science we are learning about identifying some basic forms of energy such as light, heat, sound, electrical, and mechanical.

Fourth Grade

In ELA, students are wrapping up Unit 2 in which they focus on analyzing fiction texts. Students worked on argumentative writing in which they created their claim in response to a writing prompt and wrote an essay including text evidence and examples to support their claim. In Math, students are continuing to learn different strategies to solve multi-digit multiplication equations. We will be moving into division in the upcoming weeks. In Science, students are learning about rocks, minerals, weathering and erosion. We will be learning about the earth's movements in the upcoming weeks.

Fifth Grade

Fall is here and our 5th grade scholars are excited about everything they are learning! In ELA, they just finished Unit 2 and learned about valuing people's good qualities. Students worked on an essay after conducting a character study. They will be sharing that with their parents soon. They will begin Unit 3 within the next few days and will learn about the U.S. Constitution. Our current focus in math is to practice division with whole numbers and decimals. Remember that knowing their multiplication tables is key to success when learning to divide. During the upcoming weeks, you should be able to ask your children questions about the Solar System because that is what they will be learning in science. We encourage all families to continue to support our 5th grade eagles during their last flight at Meadowbrook Elementary.

Media

In the media center this month we are about digital learning citizenship. Students will be introduced to using the internet in a safe and responsible way. Please remind students to log their minutes on Beanstack.

Art

Hello parents! Kindergarten and 1st grade have finished learning about lines and they are now learning how to create a weaving! Both grades are practicing their over/under technique, but 1st grade had to cut their own loom! 2nd graders are completing their Molas and are now beginning a project about abstract minimalism. 
