- The Mirror Lake Title I link will inform Title I parent Resource Center parents monthly and/or quarterly by posting flyers and agendas on the school's website.
- Mirror Lake Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) PLC will update the school's website with a curriculum and special projects. This will be done quarterly or as often as necessary.
- The Mirror Lake Title I Liaison, as well as other staff designees, will inform parents about the school's parent resource center, which includes the Media Center, Parent Resource Room and front lobby where a computer, table, chair and instructional materials are available. The flyers and agenda will go home weekly. The use of the center will be monitored through registration sheets.
