
eLearning Expectations



IREADY DIAGNOSTIC

iReady's Diagnostic Assessment will be administered starting September 8, 2020. The assessment window is from 9/8/20-9/25/2020. This is not an assessment that is used for a letter grade. This diagnostic assessment is used to find the areas of strengths and weaknesses of your child. Therefore, it is essential that children do this on their OWN. Please do not assist your child. The learning path will be developed for your child based on these results. It is critical that students take the diagnostic seriously and do their best. Once iReady develops their learning path, teachers will be able to adjust and modify their lessons. example, if they feel the child has mastered a skill, they can either add an enrichment lesson or assign other lessons based on their need.





BREAKFAST & LUNCH


Grab-and-Go meals are available for students on Tuesday and Thursday from 11:00 AM – 1:00 PM and from 3:00 PM – 5:00 PM. Students or their parents will be able to pick up multiple meals at a time by walking or driving to the back car loop. Parents must have identification for their student to pick up meals if the student is not present. Recommended forms of identification include student ID's, report cards, and birth certificates. Identification must be present at each meal service.


TITLE ONE

Mirror Lake Elementary is a Title One School. Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools. The goal of Title I is a higher quality of education for every child. The program serves millions of children in elementary and secondary schools each year and we are happy to be a part of this federal program and its benefits.

The Florida Department of Education receives funds from the federal government. Districts receive Title I funds from Department of Education, and the school district distributes these funds to schools based on the percentage of children eligible for free/reduced price lunch; however, students do not have to be from low-income families to receive help. For Title I Schoolwide Programs: Our students are in a Title I School-wide program. This means that our Title I money can be used to upgrade the educational program in ways that may impact every student in the school. This also means that every parent/guardian of a student in our school is a Title I parent! The schools set goals for improvement, measure student progress, using standards set forth in the state's Title I plan, develop programs that add to regular classroom instruction, and involve parents in all aspects of the program.
