#### **Tips to Support Science Learning**

- 1. Value your child's questions. Encourage him or her to share their perspective and observations.
- 2. Explore and find the answers together.
- 3. Give children time and space to explore.
- 4. Accept that explorations are often messy.
- 5. Learn from mistakes together. A mistake can lead to all kinds of possibilities and it provides opportunities for you and your child to refine your ideas, understanding, and hypotheses.
- 6. Invite curiosity. Observations and questions can create a climate of discovery key to scientific learning.
- 7. Support further exploration. Guide your child by asking questions like, "What might happen if we try this?"
- 8. Encourage children to record their observations. Writing, drawing, or taking photographs are all ways to record observations
- 9. Make good use of your electronic devices. Take pictures, record sounds, use a website or app to learn more about a specific phenomenon or creature.
- 10. Use items you have at home to experiment and explore

Question #2: How does changing the angle of a block impact the speed of a ball?

Question #3: What will sink and what will float?

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#### Terrific 3rd Grade

Can you believe it is March already? That means we are just DAYS away from FSA! Our Third Graders have been busy working hard in preparation for the big test. This is the main event that we've been training for all school year! We have no doubt that they are going to do phenomenal utilizing the strategies we've instilled and exposed them to. ELA testing will take place on Tuesday and Wednesday April 2-3rd. Along with test prep, we have been continuing to work on our Keystone Portfolio's, which are an alternative promotion criteria. We have been learning about Animal Classifications, Plant Cycles, Presidents and various influential African Americans this last month. We look forward to learning about some leading women as we honor Women's History Month in March. The students have been busy mastering their facts and beginning fractions and elapsed time in math. Remember, the students should leave third grade having their multiplication and division facts up to ten mastered, in order to achieve success in fourth grade! Reflex math is the BEST way to achieve fluency and mastery of facts when used consistently. We have multiple onsite field trips this month and next with the Museum of Discovery and Science. The students will be participating in hands on experiments relating to force and motion, as well as Animal Classifications. Be on the lookout for the next permission slips that will be sent home soon! More information regarding our big end of the year trip will be on its way after testing is completed. Just so you know, the students have at home access to iReady, Reflex Math and various other online programs we use in school. They are encouraged and welcomed to get on as often as possible for extra practice. These programs progress as they go, and have a plethora of lessons, so they will never run out! The Third-Grade teachers would like to inform you that on Monday March 11, 2019 we will be conducting a 'mock FSA' throughout the entire grade level. We are trying to replicate the testing environment and expose them to the question types, and procedures, as best we can, prior to the official date. Our goal is to ease some nerves and let them know what will be expected of them the day of. Please do your best to make sure students are on time and present that day, as we'd like to start promptly at 9am. This is very beneficial to the student's success, we appreciate your assistance in your child's education!

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#### Sensational 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade

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### Friendly 1st Grade

In ELA (Language Arts), we are covering all our standards and engaging in meaningful conversation to discuss our texts. We are using I-Ready to use technology to help us become more fluent readers.

In Math, we are adding and subtracting fluently within 20. We are using algebraic thinking to add and subtract. We are counting on and counting back, using the hundreds chart. We are also using I-Ready in Math to help us with our math standards.
