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NAGE's Reading Corner: News from our Terrific Reading Coach Ms. Torres

This year we welcomed back students to classrooms filled with brilliant teachers with bright ideas for a fabulous school year. The teachers have been busy working on using the Benchmark Assessment System (BAS) to monitor your child's reading levels; to better assist them with individualized learning goals to meet their reading needs. They are also using the iReady Diagnostic to build lessons, offer remediation, or enrichment that will enhance the students learning in both Reading and Math. We recommend the students spend 45 minutes each week completing iReady lessons in both Reading and Math. At home, please continue to read with your child, listen to them read, and model reading. Also, talk with your child about vocabulary. Did you know that a large vocabulary can turn your child into a better reader and writer? One way to increase vocabulary is to point out words that people use. An example is: you may be at a restaurant and the waiter uses the word entrée and you can have your child try and figure out what the word means by the way they used the word. Together we can build a love for reading by making reading a priority by allowing time for reading each day and by assisting them in making book selections that will motivate them to read. We encourage you to discuss your child's reading level at the next parent/teacher conference so that you can assist your child with selecting books that meet their needs.

Keeping Up with Kindergarten

Happy Fall from Kindergarten! We have been very busy in Kindergarten learning about rules and procedures! Here is an overview of the major topics that will be covered during the next couple of months! In Reading/Language Arts we are focusing on mastering letter names and letter sounds, identifying sight words, as well as the concepts of print during reading. In math, we are identifying, representing, modeling and comparing numbers 0-10. In science, we have completed our 5 senses unit! In social studies we will be discussing community helpers and their roles within the community! We are very excited because we will be having a visit from the Oakland Park fire department on Wednesday, October 10th! We will also be having our very first field trip to the farm on Monday, October 22nd! Fantastic 4th Grade

We are beginning to prepare our students for the FSA writing by studying main idea and supporting long responses with text evidence.



Parents when you read at home with your children ask them questions about the book and have them support their answer with evidence from the book. Chapter 2 in Math is in full effect! Multiplication fluency is a must. Continue to drill those facts. Reflex math.com is an excellent resource to use or free multiplication apps on the phone.

<u>Terrific 3rd Grade</u>

Our wonderful students are transitioning well into the third-grade curriculum. We are working diligently on instilling independence and responsibility in order for every student to thrive. We are focusing on various skills and strategies to enhance comprehension in Reading. Additionally, we are working on producing simple, compound, and complex sentences in Language Arts/Writing. In Math we have been focusing on addition and subtraction within one thousand, along with rounding and two step problem solving. Next, we will be moving on to multiplication. It is imperative that students practice their multiplication facts nightly. Reflex Math is a fantastic resource for students to practice their math facts and increase fluency. We are looking forward to a productive and exciting school year!



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Friendly 1st Grade

We are very excited in First Grade. The year has gone off to a good start. We are working on short vowel sounds, wrapping up the short E, short I and short O. In Math, we are in transition. We have wrapped up in Addition with numbers between 0-20. Now, we are working on Subtraction between 0-20. We continue to log in and use the I-Ready program on the computers. We have had several exciting in-class projects. The children are becoming familiar with Concept Thinking Maps to organize ideas and review Reading Target Skills. We have accomplished a lot in the last month of this new school year! As we move into October, there will be more exciting things to come!

Ms. Sanchez's Science Corner

In Science News, NAGE is working on using STEMscopes in grades K-5. These lessons allow for students to work collaboratively on thought-provoking activities that make abstract science concepts concrete. The STEMscope lessons are aligned with our Florida State Standards and enrich our balanced literacy approach to learning. The concept behind STEMscopes is that the students learn by doing. The students are able to interact with hands-on science learning with real world concepts appropriate for their grade level. In addition, Science A-Z incorporates Literacy with the level readers.

Counselor's Corner

During the month of September, our students participated in Peace Week and Start with Hello activities. Students decorated Starbucks coffee sleeves promoting peace, tolerance and understanding. The sleeves were given out to Starbucks customers during Peace Week, September 17-21.

Start with Hello is a program designed by The Sandy Hook Promise that brings attention to the growing epidemic of social isolation and empowers young people to create a culture of inclusion and connectedness within their school and community. We know that young children who are isolated can become victims of bullying, violence, or depression. Start with Hello teaches students, grades 2-12, the skills they need to reach out to and include those who may be dealing with chronic social isolation. Throughout the month, students had various discussions and participated in activities designed to stress the importance of looking out for kids who are alone and steps they can take to connect with others. Our students will continue to implement the goals of the program throughout the school year.



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Sensational 2nd Grade

For ELA (English Language Arts), we are following the Language Arts Florida Standards as a guide to teach. We are utilizing various resources such as the Literacy Field Guide, Journeys, Leveled Texts, Classroom Libraries, Writing Prompts, HMH Formative Assessments, as well as other resources the second-grade team shares with each other. Math curriculum—We are continuing to work on basic facts and relationships. In addition, we are working on counting and displaying numbers to 1,000. Also, we will be breaking apart numbers to make a ten. In the upcoming quarter, we will begin two-digit addition and two-digit subtraction. We are asking all students to please utilize Reflex Math at home as much as possible to build fluency. Addition and subtraction flash cards are also recommended. They can be purchased at the dollar store. i-Ready Math is also a great resource that can be used at home. We would like your children to be fluent in addition and subtraction facts through 20.* Social Studies, ELA, Science—We are currently working on the conceptual topic of community. This includes students looking at the concept of community as they study the daily lives of the Native Americans and the early American settlers. In Science, we are currently working on learning to classify objects, uses of energy, life cycles, and air. The next conceptual topic (October-December) will be cause and effect where students explore the concept of cause and effect as they recognize that actions have consequences, and that consequences can have positive or negative impacts. In *Science, we will be learning about changes in matter, states of matter, and distinguishing body parts.* **Overall**, the second-grade team is diligently working together to make sure your child is receiving the best education possible. We are collaborating formally at least once weekly to plan lessons and reflect on past lessons. We also work together to come up with remediation and enrichment tools if a child requires either. The second-grade team works together DAILY to ensure academic success for all our wonderful students.
