Advance payment may be made. Send money with your child to turn in to the cafeteria staff first thing in the morning.

Bus Transportation

Under Florida statue, bus transportation is provided only for students who live two or more miles from school (by the shortest walking distance). Prior to the beginning of the school year, a transportation mailer will be sent to the registered address for the student listing the bus route number, bus stop assignment location and the pickup and drop off times for the bus stop. It is suggested that students arrive at the assigned bus stop at least ten (10) minutes before the published bus stop time. Students are expected to abide by the school bus operator's instructions during boarding the bus, while on the bus and when departing the bus at the bus stop or school location. Please note that it may take a few days to get the transportation system flowing systematically. Please be patient. Contact the school with transportation concerns.

Code of Conduct

Bike Compound

The Forum has one member to report to the School Advisory Council, which then sends a representative to the district SAC.
