**** IMPORTANT REMINDERS**

VISITORS

All visitors must enter through our single point of entry. Visitors must ring the bell next to the Front Office door and show your valid identification on the camera above the bell so that we may verify you are either a parent/guardian or an approved person on the student's emergency contact card. Please plan accordingly if you are picking up a student. We do not have students report to the office for early dismissal until we have verified identification.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Code of Student Conduct contains rules and expectations for students at school, off school grounds, and at school sponsored events. Among these rules are guidelines on technology use, as well as items that are prohibited such as weapons (i.e., knives or firearms), drugs, tobacco products, e-cigarettes and other vapor devices.

Parents and students are responsible for knowing the guidelines for technology use, that weapons and drugs should never be brought to school, school grounds, or at school sponsored events. Violation of the rules and expectations outlined in the Code of Student Conduct will be addressed accordingly using the district's Discipline Matrix.

MANDATORY UNIFORM SCHOOL

Peters Elementary has adopted a school wide mandatory unified dress program. As specified in School Board Policy #5309, violations of the uniform policy shall be subject to the same consequences as violations of the dress code of the Code of Student Conduct.

The school uniform will consist of the following:

Bottoms: Navy or khaki pants, capris, shorts, skirts, shorts, or jumpers. No jeans.

Tops: White, red or blue short and long sleeve collared (polo-style) shirts. No emblems or designer labels, except the Peters Elementary logo. Peters t-shirts, which can be purchased from the PTA, are also allowed on Fridays.

Shoes: Sneakers, athletic shoes, leather shoes, boat shoes with enclosed toes or backs. No sling-backs, clogs or open toed shoes.



REPORTING AN ABSENCE

HEAD START

In Head Start we are so excited to be back at school for 2024. We would like to thank all our parents for being so helpful and supportive! In January and February, classes will be given their mid-year assessments. This will show the growth students have made as well as the areas we need to target to get ready for next year. This winter, our four-year-old classes will begin assessments on phonological awareness. Phonological awareness is the understanding of different ways that spoken language can be broken into smaller parts and manipulated. It is a very important skill for pre-reading that differs from phonics which focuses on the letters as opposed to the letter sounds. Both are important. We use the Heggerty Phonemic Awareness Curriculum for Pre-K. **** KINDERGARTEN**

We want to wish you and your family Happy New Year! In English Language Arts, we are finishing up our unit on writers tell many stories students understand with prompt and support the job of the author, illustrator, the characters, setting and major events that occur in stories. We are continuing to explore a lot of books and express our opinions about them through dictation, drawing and composing informative, expository and explanatory texts. In Small groups, we are also continuing to review CVC words, associate long and short vowel sounds with spelling. Blending and segmenting syllables in spoken words! These Skills are necessary to enhance our student vocabulary, capitalization and punctuation in spelling when writing as well as prepare them for reading fluently!

We will also be starting our new unit, unit 5 Technology at home and school; our panda scholars will learn the importance of why, when, where, and how we use technology. In Math, our students are learning to add and subtract numbers 0-10 and break apart numbers and objects, we are using counters, blocks, foam shapes to support our panda scholar's math skills. Our students enjoy math, and as educators of young children, we want to continue to make math fun for them!

In science, we are learning all about our five senses and related body parts, with our eyes we see, ears we hear, fingers we touch, and mouth we taste. We have a lot of exciting experiments we will be doing in class from fruit tasting, to shaving cream, sink or float and guessing what we hear in the "mystery box" just to name a few! These hands-on experiences will



promote effective student learning. In Social Studies, we are continuing to develop and understand how to use and create a timeline. We are also learning about American History comparing children and families of today with those in the past and recognizing the importance of U.S. symbols, national holidays and celebrations! We are so excited to continue to provide the best quality care and education for your child. Happy 2024!

We will also be taking our Benchmark Unit 4 assessment this month. Having your child practice their sight words and reading for at least 20 minutes each night should help your student be successful on this assessment. ₹ SECOND GRADE

Happy New Year, students and parents! We are in the middle of the 2nd quarter and if you haven't noticed already, your child's classroom and homework assignments are becoming more rigorous. In reading, we are continuing our focus on main idea and details, text features, point of view and comparing two-stories. In math, students will be introduced to time, measurement and the continued focus of adding and subtracting two- and three-digit numbers.

For additional assistance at home, second grade students can also log-on to i-READY reading and math for at home enrichment. This program is used in the classroom, so students are very familiar with it.

The second-grade students had the opportunity to view the Nutcracker and visit the Plantation Fire-Station. They all had a blast and enjoyed the experience.

₩ FOURTH GRADE




