

III. Principal's Address - Mrs. Hautigan

Testing & Assessments

- Final major testing completed: Biology EOC and AP/AICE exams.
- AP Psychology rescheduled due to the College Board system crash.
- Makeup exams are ongoing through the following Friday.

School Performance Updates

- Anticipated school grade to maintain B.
- Literacy gains noted: Moved from 27th to 12th in district ranking over 7 years.
- US History pass rate: 78%
- Noted literacy and acceleration gains as key areas for school grade improvements.

Graduation & End-of-Year Events

- Graduation: Thursday following final exams.
- Seniors taking final exams; cap and gown pickup scheduled.
- Anticipated graduation rate: ~99%
- Final exam schedule and early release times communicated.

Prom Recap

- Held at Gulfstream, Hallandale.
- Well attended and praised by students.

Cambridge Video Project

Piper was selected by Cambridge International for a national documentary.

- Interviews conducted with students, teachers, and administration.
- Highlights the school's academic excellence and Cambridge implementation

College Application Boot Camp (CAP Program)

- Dates: Immediately following the end of the school year.
- Open to rising seniors.
- Sessions will include:
 - o College matching, application completion, essay writing.
 - FAFSA and financial aid.
 - Letters of recommendation and scholarship preparation.
- Cost: \$40 (including binder and materials).
- The PTSA will support lunch options (pizza or bring-your-own).

Additional Events

- Upcoming essay writing workshop during study hall.
- Comprehensive info sheets and QR codes provided to attendees.

- Clarification provided on payment issue:
 - One terminated employee was accidentally omitted from A+ fund distribution; will be paid by SAC accountability funds.
 - Three additional employees were on the roster but not paid due to district error; they will also receive funds.



Budget Cuts Overview

- Countywide reductions due to:
 - Declining enrollment.
 - Loss to charter/private schools.
 - Increased cost of living.
- High schools impacted most.

Staffing Projections

• Reductions across most departments (ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies).



- Notable loss: one assistant principal and two clerical staff.
- Media specialist and BRACE advisor retained.
- ESE and VEEP programs to continue, pending resource availability.

Accountability Funds

- No new accountability funding from the state expected.
- Current SAC balance: \$25,000 to be carried forward.

Concerns Shared

- Reduction in tutoring, extended learning, and resources.
- Loss of Cambridge rollover funds and reduced support for exams.
- Commitment to advocacy and transparency emphasized by principal.

- Free/reduced lunch applications returning next year due to the end of COVID relief funds.
- SAC reminded about the need to re-establish student lunch accounts.
