NEW Safety Procedures

Our District is focused on maintaining safety for students, staff, and visitors at every Broward County Public school. Below are updates to safety procedures that will be in effect the first week of school to ensure all our students are safe. These procedures are aligned to Broward County School's safety expectations for all campuses.

Beginning Wednesday, August 15, 2018, all the gates surrounding the school will be <u>closed and</u> <u>locked</u> from 8:30 am until 1:40 pm. Gates will be locked each day that students are on campus during regular school hours.

To gain access to our campus, you <u>MUST</u> call the front office when you arrive at the main gate and a staff member will come open the gate. When you leave, a staff member will reopen the gate, so you may exit.

Additionally, during drop off and dismissal, staff will be posted at each gate opening.

Please ensure your student arrives to school BEFORE 8:00 am every day so you can avoid the extra time of waiting for staff to open the gate for you. As always, students are not to be dropped off earlier than 7:30 am due to lack of adult supervision on campus.

Illnesses

Please remember to keep your student home if he/she is ill. Sick students can easily infect others. If a child becomes ill at school, and after a period of rest in the clinic, cannot return to class, you will be notified to pick up your student. Children cannot remain at school when ill. Any student having or suspected of having a communicable disease will not be permitted to attend school. Any student returning to school after having a communicable disease must provide a doctor's note indicating that return to school is safe.

Is It Your Child's Birthday?

We all love birthday celebrations! Parents are asked to keep in mind that school board policy states <u>only</u> store-bought cupcakes can be brought in to the cafeteria. Full size sheet cakes that require cutting are not permitted. Pizza and other food items cannot be given out.

Additionally, decorations such as tablecloths, paper plates, balloons, etc. are <u>NOT</u> permitted. Please refrain from giving out goody bags, as they become a distraction once the children return to class. Thank you for your support!

Character Education



During the month of September students, faculty and staff will be practicing the character trait "Cooperation."

Cooperation is defined as working with others to accomplish a common goal.

Each class will select one Star Student that best displays the character trait to be recognized at the Star Student Assembly.

School Security Badges

We have a single point of entry system at Orange Brook Elementary along with the STAR system that is in use in all Broward County Public Schools. The STAR (Security Tracking and Response) system is a security tracking method that screens school visitors against state and national databases.

Visitors to our site <u>MUST</u> bring identifications (driver's license, passport, state I.D., etc.) and register into the system. Individuals are given a badge to wear on campus on the date of the visit. The badge must be returned to the front office before leaving. Thank you for helping us keep our students safe!



Emergency Preparedness

Broward County Public Schools practice monthly school lockdowns as part of their overall annual safety plan. Parents are reminded that in the event Orange Brook Elementary goes into a FULL BUILDING LOCK DOWN **NO VISITORS (including parents) will be allowed onto school campus or inside the building. Parents/visitors inside the building will not be permitted to leave.**

In the event of a real emergency, the local authorities would intervene, and a parent information site will be established near the school. Parents would then be encouraged to stay tuned to local media, prior to visiting the site, for location specific information and to have proper identification when they arrive. Another source of information during times of emergencies is the **Broward Schools Security Hotline at 754-321-0911.**

Student Safety

Now is the best time to review safety with your child and make a plan in the case of an emergency. Students should be reminded to follow these general rules as well as following your family's own individualized safety plan:

- ✤ Never walk to or from school alone
- $\boldsymbol{\diamond}$ Never accept a ride from a stranger or approach a stranger in a car
- Never provide a stranger with personal information such as name, address, or phone number
- Use designated crosswalks and obey crossing guards
- Report suspicious persons to the closest adult
- ✤ Always return to school if you need additional help




K.I.N.G.S. Court

Traffic and Parking Safety Alert



Please help us make car rider morning drop off and afternoon pick up run more smoothly. Drivers are asked to please review and adhere to the following information.

Tips for the morning:

- <u>Pull all the way forward to the end of the sidewalk</u>, leaving no gaps (except for the crosswalks). Please do not stop in front of the doors to let your student exit.
- **<u>NEVER</u>** allow a student to exit the car from the driver's side. The oncoming traffic in the pass-through lane (if open) is a hazard.
- Stay in your vehicle at all times. If you need to help your student with anything- please park in the small parking lot as to not impede traffic. Please be sure hugs, kisses, paperwork signing, hair brushing, etc. are done prior to entering car line.
- Pay attention for pedestrians in the crosswalks.
- Additionally, pedestrians are asked to not step out into traffic.
- **<u>NEVER</u>** move the orange safety cones or drive around them, on them or over them! The pass-through lane is closed in the morning so be sure to arrive before 7:30am for conferences.

Tips for the afternoon:


- Please place the name hanger on your rearview mirror. Staff members will call for your child.
- **Pull all the way forward**, leaving no gaps (except for the crosswalks).
- Do not stop at the grade level groups- your student will come to your car.
- **<u>NEVER</u>** allow a student to enter the car from the driver's side. The oncoming traffic in the pass-through lane is a hazard.
- Stay in your vehicle at all times. Continue pulling forward until your student comes to you. Do not exit to look for your student unless you are in a dedicated parking space.
- Pay attention to the staff members' instructions.
- Pedestrians are asked to not step out into traffic.
- **<u>NEVER</u>** move the orange safety cones or drive through them, on them or over them!
- Please <u>ONLY</u> park in dedicated parking spaces (do NOT park in handicap spaces without proper authorization). There is NEVER parking in the pass-through lane.

Most importantly- NEVER use your cell phone at any point in the car line!

Tips for parking:

- Parents and visitors are encouraged to park only in the small parking lot immediately after the drop off/pick up lane.
- When extra parking is needed for special events, the gate to the field will be opened. The gate is located on S. 46th Avenue near our new electronic marquee.
- NEVER park in a handicap space without proper authorization and hanging tag.
- NEVER park in the pass-through lane or exit the vehicle in the pass-through lane to pick up your student.

If everyone works together during the morning and afternoon rush, our students will be safer and the car line will operate more quickly. Thank you for your support!



The scholarship application is web based and to apply you may use a smart phone, tablet, or computer.

The following information and documents will be needed to complete the online application process.

1) Each student listed must be approved for Free or Reduced-price meals for the current school year.

- 2) You will need each student's 10-digit student number. If you do not have it, the school can provide you with the number.
- 3) Have an active, monitored email account for communication about your scholarship.
- 4) All students on the application must be registered, active, and all fees paid in full prior to applying for a scholarship.

You will need to attach documents to the scholarship application for each adult in the household who is 18 years or older. The documents attached must be a clear, readable photograph or a scanned form.

- Two (2) most current pay checks showing hours worked
- Most current year tax return- IRS Form 1040 and related schedules, including proof that tax return has been filed with the IRS
- If currently attending college, a current class schedule
- Proof of current self-employment status
- If unemployed, proof of unemployment date within 30 days of application
- If medically disabled, current documentation from doctor dated within 30 days of application.
- If a foster parent, a letter supporting foster status of student
- You may be required to provide additional documentation not listed

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
