EARLY DISMISSAL POLICY

While we understand that certain situations necessitate the early dismissal of students, we ask that you keep these to a minimum. Signing out early may count towards establishing a pattern of non-attendance that may indicate early signs of truancy. A pattern of non-attendance may be established when early sign-outs exceed 5 days in a marking period or 10 days in two marking periods. If you know in advance that you will be picking up your child early, please write a note to the teacher so the student will be ready when you arrive. We will call the student out of class when you come in to the office. Students will only be released to parents/guardians who registered the child or indicated another adult be allowed to pick up the child. Please have identification available.



 to receiving a State traffic citation.
- wheeled siectic vehicles* are any fourwheeled siectic vehicles whose top speed is greater than 20 miles per hour, but not greater than 25 miles per hour, including neighborhood electric vehicles. Low-speed vehicles must comply with the same sofety, registration, insurattee, and traffic laws as east and may only be operated by a licensed driver (40 C.F.R. a. 57), 500 and a. 316.21(2)).
- "Low-speed vehicles" are restricted to use on public roadways with a posted speed limit of 35 miks per hour or less.

Battery-Provered Vehicle Concerns

Owners of golf carts and loss-speed vehicles should also be ewere that the Detection used to power these vehicles and carbon userson inconacide as a colerbas, adorless, neatcless, and petentially deadly gas that can seep into your home during the barroy charging process. More than 100 people are killed each year by carbon, nonoxide, poisoning. For propor charging and strage of battory-speciated vehicles please fellow these safety guidelines:

- Maintain proper hittery water levels.
- Eustree battery daps and on cight.
- Charge halteries using unit the recurrenced current multiply higher
- Never charge beceries overnight
- Charge batteries in a well ventilated urea.
- Durable a carbon manoxide detector in your home adjacent to where you charge batteries.
