Happy New Year and Welcome 2025! WOW, you blink and an entire year has flown by. We hope you and your families have had a wonderful two weeks off and enjoyed the Holiday Season. We know these breaks are well deserved for our students. Over these last few weeks before break, the students enjoyed a lot of fun holiday activities to end their week. Just a friendly reminder we do start back with students on the 6th of January and there is a teacher planning day on the 10th. This was an update to the calendar after the two hurricane days back in the fall.

January begins a busy time of year for students as we are getting into our final stages of preparation for the end of the year testing. During the first three weeks, all of our students will be taking their second FAST Progress Monitoring Assessment. Please make sure you pay attention to schedules and weekly Parent Link for the exact days for each grade level. This PM data is really important for the students to see where there are gaps and gives us a very good predictor of their final PM. Parents in grades 3-5, talk to your children about their goal setting for both I-Ready and FAST. See if they have made growth or met their target. We want the students to understand it isn't always about being the highest or reaching proficiency, it is about personal goals and growth.

Each year Parkside collects hundreds of jackets, sweaters, water bottles, etc. from students who have forgotten to pick them up or leave them at school. We do have an identified area in the cafeteria where we place all lost and found, but twice a year we do donate these items to a charity. We always send Parent Links out about this a few weeks ahead of time letting families know when this will take place. Please continue to write their names in these items and make sure you are checking with your children each day. If you ever want to stop by and check the lost and found, please do.

Kindergarten Happy New Year!!!! As we start the second half of the school year, we will hit the ground READING!!! Make sure you are reading with your child every day. We will continue to work on CVC words and blending letter sounds. Make sure you are reviewing sight words daily. The more fluent your child is with their sight words the more confident of reader they will become. We will continue working on addition and subtraction in math. You can practice addition facts by playing fun games at home to keep it fresh. Continue to read daily with your child and talk about what you are reading to check for understanding. We will have our first field trip on January 14th to see a play and more to come in the spring.

First Grade It's hard to believe we are halfway through the school year! We hope everyone had a nice winter break! As we begin the third quarter, we are focusing on a few new things. To begin with, in Reading we are busy practicing reading strategies so that all the first graders continue to make progress. Be on the lookout for reading comprehension passages going home!

In Math, we are continuing to learn about numbers and a counting sequence. We are starting topic 8 Counting and Modeling Numbers, (is a tough chapter), so please take time to practice math on a daily basis. Please practice math fluency facts, as well!! We will be starting Topic 9 comparing numbers. As we settle back in from the break, we are learning about Earth Surfaces. We've discussed what materials are on the surface of the earth like rocks, soil, and bodies of water. Have your child go outside and find parts of the Earth surface!

As always, please continue to read nightly, practice spelling and sight words, and having conversations with your child about what they are learning in school.

Second Grade Welcome back second graders and Happy New Year! We hope you all had a wonderful and restful Winter Break. A BIG thank you to our awesome PTA for all their time and dedication with all the holiday activities the past month! We are looking forward to 2025 and completing this second semester strong.

This month we will be taking our STAR PM2 Assessments on January 8th and 16th. We will be starting Unit 5 Benchmark in Reading. In math, we will be beginning Unit 8- Understanding Fractions. Continue to work on your addition and subtraction fact fluency and working with 2-digit numbers using your strategies. In science, we will continue to work on Magnets and begin learning about Rocks. In Social Studies, we are continuing and finishing learning about Colonial America. Please continue to work on I-Ready 45 minute per week on both subjects.

Third Grade

HAPPY NEW YEAR!! 2025 is going to be EPIC! This is the year your third grader should become a fourth grader! We had lots of fun activities and themes during the last week before winter break, but it's time to dig deep! In the first week of January, third-graders are starting Benchmark Unit 5 in their classrooms with a focus on the Advancement in Technology and on the essential question "What is the value in innovation?" In Reading, Language and Grammar, we will concentrate on compound sentences, context clues and text structures, and continuing to identify and repair fragments and run-ons. In Writing, students will revisit Opinion writing citing evidence. We will also work on understanding of author's purpose and author claim. Toward the end of the month, we will concentrate on conjunctions, real-world perspectives, other types of poetry, and evidence-based inferences. We will also take the FAST PM-2 assessments in MATH and READING.

In Math, we will continue with Topic 7: Adding Multi-digit whole Numbers. Teachers have also begun doing daily math review activities to keep students fresh on all Math concepts. At the end of each week, students may be getting a brief quiz on those particular items as a way of monitoring key standards.

In Social Studies, we will be concentrating on the values and history around Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and the impact his messages have had on society. This will also bring us into deeper studies on Black History. In Science, as we finish up FRICTION, we will explore OBJECTS IN THE SKY, culminating to our next field trip on January 27 to see "Janet's Planets" at Parker Playhouse. Permission slips and payment details have already gone home. Please make sure to fill out and pay as soon as possible. Details to follow!!

As always, please make time for reading at home! This can include reading to your child, having your child read aloud to you or a sibling, or just reading silently. A great trick is to turn on the Closed Captioning on all your TVs. It is nearly impossible NOT to read words that come across the screen! This is NOT to replace reading books, or other literature, just a great practice tool!

Fourth Grade With the New Year right around the corner, our 4th graders are working at a faster pace, exhibiting better student expectations, and are growing as both learners and people. In regards to math, they have worked on being fluent in division. In reading, we have worked on wrapping up fiction and moving to non-fiction. We have heavily discussed author's perspective and point of view. In social studies, we are learning about Native American tribes and moving to European explorers. In science, we are learning about plant and animal life cycles. In writing, we are working on coordinating conjunctions and using correct homophones. Had a great time mixing up some holiday fun and finished off 2024 on a good note!

Fifth Grade Hello families!

We hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season! Information has come home regarding the 5th end of year field trip. The deposit is \$173.00, and we will be able to determine the remaining balance once all deposits come in. The deposit is due by January 12, 2025. There will also be a form coming home regarding the Sawgrass Nature Center field trip. The cost of this trip will be only \$10.

IReady Diagnostics have been completed, and your child's teacher will discuss with you are your next conferences. Upon our return FAST PM 2 for Mathematics is on January 9th and English Language Arts is on January 15th.

In reading, we will begin a fiction unit that will address concepts of character development throughout the story, figurative and analyzing character perspectives. In Math, we will begin Topic 7, which covers plotting coordinates, interpretation of line graphs, identify and create rules for numerical patterns. For science we will exploring and the solar system and in Social Studies we will "Explore Explorers".
