### Notes from the Teachers

Welcome to Kindergarten! Thanks to all the parents that came to Open House! We encourage you to be a part of your child's academic success here at Parkside. We will be working with your child on recognizing letters and sounds. We are starting chapter 1 in math and homework pages will be sent home. In science, your child will be learning about their 5 senses. Please be sure to check your child's black Parkside folder and return it to school daily.

First Grade

First Grade is off to a terrific start! As you know, the first few weeks of school have been quite busy. Your child has been learning and adapting to the new routines and procedures of First Grade. It is amazing to see the progress that has taken place in such a short time. Keep up the awesome work, families! We have also been spending time getting to know each other and making our classrooms feel like home. We look forward to a fantastic year!

Second Grade

We're back! Thank you for sharing your children with us. We would like to thank you for all of the supplies you sent in. They will be put to good use. Please remember these important items:

- Send your child with a jacket labeled with their name.
- Practice tying shoes with your child each day.
- Check your child's backpack each day for notes and homework.
- Keep in mind that school begins at 8:00.
- Please drop your child at 7:30 so that your child has time to eat breakfast.
- We look forward to a happy and successful year!

Third Grade

Dear Parents,

We are excited to have your child in our classes! During the month of August and September, we will be assessing your child in both reading and math to get a better understanding of the instructional needs of

each child. Third Grade is a very important year, so we encourage all parents to attend the Open House where we will explain promotion criteria. This includes a portfolio of work called Keystones. It measures mastery on all reading standards. During the first quarter we will be focusing on the following in each curriculum area:

Reading: Reading fiction and identifying story elements. Reading nonfiction and being able to compare/contrast text, as well as utilize text features.

Math: Number Sense which includes estimating, addition, and subtraction

Science: Identify vertebrates and invertebrates and name characteristics of each.

Social Studies: Identify map parts and read maps.

Writing: Identify types of sentences and understand the purpose of subject and predicate.

We will also be attending a play at the end of October. We ask that you have your child work on i-Ready at least 30 minutes a week at home in both reading and math.

🗩 Welcome back to a wonderful year of learning! We are excited for you to meet our 4th Grade Team. Ms. Boyle is teaming up with Mrs. Mason again this year. Each teacher is teaching their own homeroom English and Language Arts (ELA). Ms. Boyle is teaching both classes Science and Social Studies, while Mrs. Mason is teaching both classes Math. We welcomed a new teacher to Parkside this year, Ms. Vuckovich. She is teaming with Mrs. Sanchez. Again, each teacher is teaching their own homeroom English and Language Arts (ELA). Ms. Vuckovich is teaching both classes Science and Social Studies, while Mrs. Sanchez is teaching both classes Math. Ms. Cruz has a self-contained classroom model. And lastly, Ms. Williams has a self-contained 4th and 5th grade classroom. Presently we are getting to know your children as they are taking the beginning of year assessments. We have observed that there are several students that don't know their basic multiplication facts. We strongly encourage you to practice these with your student at home by simply using flash cards or asking math facts. We ask that you check your child's homework and planner daily. Use this planner as a tool to communicate with your child's teacher. In addition, all 4th grade students should be reading for at least of 30 minutes daily. Novel studies are starting which means your child will probably have reading and math homework daily. Along with a couple of local educational field trips, 4th graders will have the opportunity to go on an overnight trip to St. Augustine in February. Be on the lookout for additional information. Fifth Grade

Fabulous Fifth Grade: We have had a fabulous few weeks getting to know your children. Community building activities for the students were a success and we are working cohesively as a 5th grade team. In Science, students are observing and making inferences in preparation for their first investigation. In

Math, students are learning the patterns of place value when multiplying and dividing by ten, one hundred, and one thousand. We are moving on to exponents. In Reading, the students have been familiarizing themselves with various character traits and the ability to infer these traits through clues in their reading. We are looking forward to a wonderful year!



Connected: Talking about the school day lets your child know you care. Ask him to share two good things that happened during the day. Prompt him with specific questions, such as "Which multiplication facts did you practice?" Prepared. Studying a little every day is the best way to learn new material. Help your youngster choose a time for homework when he is most alert – and try not to change it. Rested. A set bedtime helps kids fall asleep more quickly. #### Aftercare Courier, September 2018

Welcome back to another exciting year here in Before and Aftercare. We are pleased that you have chosen us to provide your childcare needs. At this time we are looking for people who want to work with children. If you know of anyone who is interested in working between the hours of 2-6pm, please visit the BASCC website and fill out an application. You can also give me call here at 754-322-7850 – 7893 after 2:00. We are also in the process of hiring a security monitor for both before and aftercare. If you are interested in working early in the morning before you head out to the gym, we could certainly use the help. The hours are 6:15am-7:30am and 1:00 until closing. Because we are required to hire a security monitor for the program, the prices for Before and After School Child Care Programs will change beginning with the next payment that is due by September 11, 2018 as follows:

Aftercare Full Fees were \$183.00, beginning with period 2 the new fees are \$194.00 Second sibling fees were \$174.00, It will now be \$184.00 Beforecare was \$45.00, it will now be \$48.00

You can still pay online or at the school. Remember these changes go into effect for Pay Period 2. There are still a few magnets available for those of you who did not pick one up when you registered. These magnets show you the break down of days that you pay for each month and the absolute last day to make the payment before your child is withdrawn and you are assessed an additional \$25.00 re-registration fee. Please review the school-wide goals with your child and encourage them to always do their best! Lastly, our program end time is 6:00pm each evening. If you come after 6 you will be assessed a late fee which must be paid before you pay for the next pay period. Thanks again for allowing us to provide your after school care needs.

Dr. Karen L. Mapp

Karen L. Mapp, Ed.D., is a Senior Lecturer on Education at the Harvard Graduate School of Education (HGSE) and the Faculty Director of the Education Policy and Management Master's Program. Over the past twenty years, Dr. Mapp's research and focus have been on the cultivation of partnerships among families, community members, and educators that support student achievement and school improvement. Dr. Mapp's research and work in the area of parent and family engagement is extensive. She has served at the helm of many community projects that have brought fundamental growth and impactful changes to school districts, families and communities across the nation. Dr. Mapp holds a Doctorate and Masters in Education from the Harvard Graduate School of Education, a Master's in Education from Southern Connecticut State University, and a Bachelor's degree in Psychology from Trinity College in Hartford, CT. Karen is the author of numerous publications, with her most recent work being Powerful Partnerships: A Teacher's Guide to Engaging Families for Student Success (2017).

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
