This week we celebrated the 100th day of school. Notes from the Teachers

Kindergarten

We have survived the first 100 days of kindergarten! We are now in the 3rd quarter of the school year and have less than 80 days left! We have our Safety Town field trip February 6-8th. Your child's teacher has the specific date for their class. In reading, we will continue to work on distinguishing common types of texts such as storybooks, poems, etc. In math, your child will learn all about counting and recognizing numbers 11-19 in chapter 7! We will continue to work on adding and subtraction within 5 so be sure to practice at home! In science, we will continue learning how some books and other media portray animals and plants with various characteristics and behaviors that they do not have in real life. We will also observe and compare different animals and plants. In writing, we will work on strengthening your child's writing skills by composing informative and explanatory topics. Please remember, reading bags are to be returned to school daily and homework is due every Friday!

2nd GRADE

Second graders have been busy learning about text features in reading. Take some time to read nonfiction books/ articles with your child so they can show what they're learning! *Time for Kids* online is a great resource. We are continuing our math lessons about adding and subtracting with regrouping. We encourage your children to practice these skills at home. Look for the field trip form labeled Bookin'-Cookin'. The money is due February 15th! This is an in house field trip. We appreciate your continued support!

4th grade

Hard to believe that we are over halfway through the school year! In the upcoming weeks we are going to be spending a lot of time working on fractions and decimals in Math. As these concepts may seem challenging for some of our students, we encourage parents to help reinforce these at home. Of course cooking is always a great way to practice fractions. It is so extremely important that your child practice their multiplication facts at home. Continue with i-Ready Math and Animated Math. These are all great programs to help with math fluency and skill concepts. We are also doing a great deal of writing these days. The type of writing that is expected of our students has changed over the years. They are expected to be able to read from 2-4 pieces of text, and then use the information from all pieces of the text to support their response to the writing prompt. You will notice more writing homework as we prepare for our FSA Writing test. Read, Read, Read! Your child should be reading almost every night for 30 minutes. We cannot stress enough the importance of reading at home. It helps build fluency and stamina. Students are getting excited about the upcoming St. Augustine trip. This is a wonderful educational experience for our 4th graders. Those students not going will be able to participate in a free in-house field trip presented by the Museum of Discovery and Science on February 19th. Please watch for those permission slips and return them in a timely manner.

As always, if you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact your child's teacher.

1st Grade

This past month, first graders have been busy reading, reading, and reading some more! As we begin the second half of the school year, reading will be our focus. The children will be taking the End of the Year Reading Test in May, and we are trying hard to get them prepared. Please be on the lookout for reading comprehension passages going home for homework. In Math, we are finished with chapter 5, *How Addition and Subtraction are Related*. Chapter 6, *Counting and Modeling Numbers*, is a tough chapter, so please take time to practice math on a daily basis. Please practice math fluency facts, as well!! In science, we are learning about plants. We've discussed plant parts and their jobs, how they grow and change, as well as what they need to grow. The children learned why we need plants and how they reproduce. We've pruned our garden, and many herbs are drying in our classrooms. We will soon begin creating our "product" using the dried herbs to sell at our School wide exhibition on March 14. We learned all about Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. the last couple of weeks. We discussed the importance of learning about history, and making sure we do not make the same mistakes in the future. The children are always VERY intrigued by history! In February, the children will learn about George Washington and Abraham Lincoln, as the country celebrates President's Day. As always, we thank you for being a part of your child's learning!

THIRD GRADE

This will be a busy month for our 3rd graders. In math, we have finished up division and multiplication. We are now diving into area and perimeter. Students will be learning how to find the area and perimeter of different shapes using measurement. In reading, we are continuing to practice our informational standards while learning about the Three Branches of Government. On February 22nd, 3rd grade will be taking their extended day field trip to Lion Country Safari. If you have not made your 2nd payment, it is due on February 6th. Please get those into your child's teacher as soon as possible. Parents are asked to send their child with a bag lunch on this day. Please be on the lookout for more information as the field trip comes closer.

Grade 5

Fifth grade had a busy January full of excitement, including our trip to Biztown. Fifth graders delved into their jobs at Biztown to experience real-world situations in the workplace, including making financial decisions and on-the-spot job training. In reading, students are wrapping up learning about Point of View and beginning to analyze multiple accounts of events in non-fiction text. Fractions are in full swing in math; students are working diligently to learn how to solve real-world problems, involving addition, subtraction, and multiplication of parts of a whole. Our budding scientists are learning all about electric circuits. Next up is the study of the solar system. All fifth grade students are working hard in project-based learning; ask your child what they're working on! Lastly, students will begin GRADE; make sure you return a signed permission slip in order for them to participate.

Counselor's Corner: February's Character Trait – Honesty

Dear Parents,
REMINDER – Your words and actions affect people's self-esteem... so be **KIND!**

Four Ways To Help Kids Manage Frustration—Learning to manage and overcome frustrations builds resilience but it can be difficult for parents to stand back and let children cope on their own.

1. Stay Calm – while you may feel anxious, angry, or even embarrassed when your child is crying, it's important that you model remaining calm yourself. It helps to remember that being a good parent doesn't mean that your child is always happy. Remind yourself that your child's age-appropriate frustration will eventually pass and both of you will survive it.
2. Be Consistent – All children need to know that they can count on their parent to guide them, support them, take care of their essential needs, and love them. Even in times of conflict, knowing how you will act when they are upset can lead to security and comfort in the relationship.
3. Pick the Right Time to Talk – You may notice that talking to your child when he or she is very emotional may not be very productive. However, children often want immediate answers and to gain what they seek instantly. It may be a relief to remember that you don't have to answer your child immediately when emotions are running high. Even if your child is frustrated it is best to wait until you are both calm to talk.
4. Practice Good Communication Skills- Listen to your child, restate your child's request and reasoning, logically explain your position, use "I" Statements... "I feel hurt when you keep leaving this mess, I want you to clean your room please.", ask your child to restate what you said

Student ID Badges



All students are **required** to wear a Parkside ID badge all day long while at school. We distribute them in the morning when they arrive and take them in the afternoon when they leave. Several students still have lost or broken their badges. We have two created for them at the beginning of the year, but once these have been used we must make an additional badge. There is a cost of \$5 per badge. Students must pay this obligation. You can either pay in cash or online. Please note this is a student obligation and will be added to the students account and this must be paid before the end of the year. If you have questions, please feel free to reach out to the school. Please remember this is a safety issue and we must have all students, staff and parents wearing identification at all times while on campus. Thanks for your help with this situation.

Aftercare Courier, February 2019

Reminder that All payments that you make covers your child for 18 school days. It may seem like you are paying for days off, but you are not. There are 180 school days, they are divided by 10 payments which ends up being 18 days each pay period. With that being said, this period will end on Monday February 11th. The new payments are due on Monday February 11, 2019. You can make a payment in person when picking up your child or you can pay on line at: <https://estore.browardschools.com> You can use this service up to 11:59p.m. on the last day to pay. The service does allow you to pay on the day after the last day, but you will be assessed an additional \$25.00 re-registration fee in which you can pay while you are on the site, or when you come in the following day.



We really need you to help us out reminding the students about our school wide behavior goals. We purposely include them in each monthly newsletter because it is extremely important that our students make them a part of their everyday school culture: *Always Do your Best, Cooperate with Others, Manage Yourself, Respect the Rights and Property of Others, and Resolve Conflicts* (Be a problem Solver).

Each month we highlight part of our parent handbook which can be found on our school website. This month we will focus on the Parent's Role and Responsibilities. You are welcome to visit the program. Please let the supervisor know when you would like to visit. A staff member will accompany all adults visiting the program to ensure safety. You are responsible for picking up your child on time, notifying the supervisor if your child is going to be absent, following payment procedures, keeping the supervisor informed of a change in emergency contact information, notifying the supervisor, if your child is going to be withdrawn from the program, and notifying the supervisor of any change in the child's health, if participation is limited. A student may be exited from the program, if a parent does not meet the above responsibilities on a consistent basis. Toys or other personal play items from home may not be brought to the program. They are not the program's responsibility, if lost.
