 $\searrow$  Welcome to Kindergarten! Thanks to all the parents who came to open house! We encourage you to be a **Kindergarten** part of your child's academic success here at Parkside. We will be working with your child on recognizing letters and sounds. We are starting chapter 1 in Math and homework pages will be sent home along with homework journals beginning in September. In Science, your child will be learning about their 5 senses. Please be sure to check your child's blue Parkside folder and return it everyday.

### First Grade

First Grade is off to a terrific start! As you know, the first few weeks of school have been quite busy. Your child has been learning and adapting to the new routines and procedures of first grade. It is amazing to see the progress that has taken place in such a short time. Keep up the awesome work, families! We have

also been spending time getting to know each other and making our classrooms feel like home. Please make sure you complete and return the beginning of the year forms as soon as possible. In addition, please check your child's "Go Home" folder on a daily basis. We look forward to a fantastic year!

Welcome back, second graders. We are so excited to start a new year here at Parkside. We hope everyone Second Grade had an enjoyable summer. All second graders got right to work during the first few weeks of school. From learning new classroom procedures to getting homework in Reading and Math. During the month of September, we will be focusing on a reading strategy: Ask and Answer questions. Parents can help with this strategy at home by using their library book or reading bag books and asking questions about the story read. In math, we are starting with even /odd, place value and making ten. If help is needed with the math homework, your child can sign onto Clever by visiting https://sso.browardschools.com. Then click ThinkCenteral, 2nd grade, Go Math, Reteach or Math on the Spot. Just In Social Studies, we are learning how to become a good citizen. We hope everyone purchases a Second Grade shirt! We will be wearing these on field trips and on Field Day! Thank you, parents, for all you do! Remember --KEEP ON READING!!

#### Third Grade

Welcome to 3rd Grade! We are excited about the school year and strongly encourage you all to attend our Open House on Wednesday, September 4th at 7:00 PM. You will hear very important information that is critical for success. We are planning some fun activities this fall. We will be attending a play and

inviting a robotics expert to the school. Academically, this is a challenging year for your child. We will applying various reading strategies to comprehend longer passages and even novels. In Math this quarter, students will be expected to round numbers, use graphs to answer real-world math problems, and begin to master multiplication facts. In science, our classes will learn the difference between vertebrates and invertebrates and become zoologists to classify an animal they discovered. Finally, in Social Studies we will be focusing on reading maps and staying current by reading Scholastic News each week. We ask that you check the planner daily, as well as, ensure that your child is reading at least 20 minutes a day.

Fourth graders have been busy getting to know one another and their new teachers. We are excited to Fourth Grade get started on a year full of growth and exciting activities! To begin the year, we are studying Life Science with a focus on a special Florida treasure, the Everglades. Students are researching the location, issues, and different animals in the ecosystem and will use technology to create presentations on the topic. Our trip to the Everglades on October 25th will be a culminating activity for that unit. In Reading, we are diving into class novels. We are focusing on the development of characters, plot summaries, and the structure of fiction. It is nice to have a character that we "get to know" as a class. Students are also being individually assessed to determine small group instructional levels moving forward. Most classes are wrapping up Chapter 1 in Math (Place Value). Students are working with numbers to the hundred thousands place in addition, subtraction and word problems. We will be moving into multiplication later this month. Please be sure to practice your basic facts so that you are able to recall them quickly and accurately! Classes who are "Multiplication Masters" will be rewarded with a prize every other Friday beginning on August 30th!

Fifth Grade is so excited about this year now that we are the positive leaders of the school. We have al-Fifth Grade >> ready begun our fabulous Reading curriculum, learning about character traits through picture book explorations. In Science we are delving into the scientific process using many hands-on activities, and in

Math we are focusing on a strong foundation in number sense and operations. It is imperative that your students know their multiplication facts fluently. We are looking forward to a successful year.

#### **Counselor's Corner**: September's Character Trait – COOPERATION

Ready to Learn ~ Setting Up Routines/Continuing to Keep Kids Moving

Bruce and John are close friends with similar abilities. Bruce does well in school, but John struggles. He often seems tired and misses assignments. Why the difference? One reason is that Bruce's family establishes daily routines to help him do his best. Consider the routines below to make your child feel more. . . Relaxed. Music can help your child avoid the morning rush. Play a soothing tape and ask him to be dressed and ready by the time it's over. Tip: On Sundays, have him put each day's outfit for the coming week on hangers labeled Monday through Friday. Energized. A good breakfast increases concentration. Offer your youngster healthy choices. Examples: a whole wheat bagel with peanut butter; orange juice blended with fruit and yogurt; instant oatmeal.



*Connected:* Talking about the school day lets your child know you care. Ask him to share two good things that happened during the day. Prompt him with specific questions, such as "Which multiplication facts did you practice?" Prepared. Studying a little every day is the best way to learn new material. Help your youngster choose a time for homework when he is most alert – and try not to change it. Rested. A set bedtime helps kids fall asleep more quickly. Suggest that your child get in bed 15 minutes early to read, make up stories, or talk quietly with you. If I can be of any assistance for your child or family please give me a call @ 754-322-7850. #### Aftercare Courier, September 2019

We're Back! We hope that everyone is getting back in the grove of things! Welcome to another exciting year of afterschool care. We try our best to give your child a variety of activities to keep them engaged and energized during our program. Please be sure to check out our parent handbook which can be found on our school's website. Just in case you can't easily access it, we will be highlighting certain sections each month in our newsletter. The phone number to reach us during the program is 754-322-7893. You can find this number in the handbook as well.



One important fact that we need everyone to know, is that we expect all students to practice our school wide discipline goals daily. You will be reminded of these as well each month. You can help in that area by asking your student how they go about self-monitoring themselves to make sure they are doing the right thing. Our list of 5 school wide behavior goals are: Always Do Your Best, Cooperate with others, Manage yourself, Respect the rights and property of others, and Resolve conflicts (Be a problem solver).

If you did not pick up a payment calendar, please ask at the aftercare desk. As a reminder our next payment of \$194.00 for aftercare, \$48.00 for before care and 2nd sibling fee of \$184.00 are due on Monday September 9, 2019. Fees must be paid by 11:00 p.m. on-line or by 6:00 in person. There are no exceptions. We have a waiting list of students who will be invited in if your spot is not secured.

All students will be scheduled for structured homework time. Not all students will complete their homework during the allotted amount of time. If you wish for your child to miss an activity to complete their homework, please discuss it with the supervisor of the program. While your child is attending the program, we encourage you to allow them to participate in all activities. We believe this will encourage creativity and help to build self-worth. Our activities give children an opportunity to develop social skills.

If your child accidentally brings their name tag home, Please put it in their backpack so that they will have it the next day. Students are required to wear name tags all day including aftercare. If your child does bring their tag home by mistake, you can help us out and make sure they return to school with their tag. This will help our afternoon run smoother.

Code Red Drills have been mandated for all schools by the State of Florida to ensure the safety of our students and staff. These Code Red Drills will be implemented on a monthly basis, similar to fire drills. The date of the drill will not be pre-announced due to potential security and attendance issues. Instead, our school will send families Parent Link messages via phone call, text message, and/or e-mail approximately 20 minutes prior to the drill to alert everybody that it is only a drill. Our school will then send a second message to families notifying you that the drill is completed. Parkside prepares for building lockdowns, evacuations, severe weather, and other emergency situations. In the event of an emergency, it is important that parents monitor Parent Link messages to en-

#### School Improvement Update



School Advisory Council (SAC): SAC is a committee of parents, community members, and teachers who meet to discuss and monitor our School Improvement Plan. The focus of SAC is primarily student achievement but many issues are discussed that affect the school. SAC has an official elected membership but all are welcome to attend each meeting.

School Advisory Forum (SAF): SAF is an open forum to discuss any school or community issue. While SAC focuses on the School Improvement Plan, SAF is the place to get more information, address any other concerns, or

share ideas that impact the school. SAF has no official membership and our SAF meetings are held back to back with our SAC meetings.

How can parents get involved and participate in the SAC/SAF committee? Parents are encouraged to attend the monthly meeting of the SAC/SAF at our school, usually on the first Thursday of each month. Our next meeting will take place on *Thursday, September 19th at 7:30 in the media center. Please come join us!* 

Why is it important for parents to be active participants? The SAC committee provides a place where parents can voice their opinions and suggestions. They have an active role in making decisions that will best serve the students. SAC also gives the opportunity for parents to actively participate in setting goals and making plans to achieve those academic goals. SAC allows for parents to identify issues that need to be addressed concerning the school climate.
