# Notes from the Teachers



How time flies! We have completed the first guarter of the school year! Kindergartners have been learning a lot about apples, pumpkins, bats, and spiders oh my! The next few weeks in reading, we will be working on identifying characters, setting, and major events in a story. Please continue practicing and reviewing sight words as well as reading daily with your child. In Math, we are starting chapter 4 and learning to compare numbers to 10. In Science, we will be learning about objects that can either be pushed or pulled. Students will explore these concepts using hands on experiments! With holidays fast approaching, your

kindergarten will also learn about families from the past and present! Please be sure to complete math and reading homework every week. A big thank you to all the parents who helped with our very first field trip to the fire station! We had an awesome time!



We have been very busy in First Grade. Reading groups are in full swing, and the children are working hard learning reading strategies to make them better readers. Please take some time to read the Parent Pipelines we send home. They are full of information that can help you help your child with reading at home. In Math, we have completed the chapters on addition/subtraction concepts, and are now learning about

different strategies to help us solve a problem. We are also working hard on math fluency to ten, as well as doubles and doubles plus one facts. Science has kept us busy, as well. We are currently learning all about scientists and properties of matter. Ask your child to tell you about some of the tools scientists use and how scientists use their senses to observe. In the next couple of weeks, we will begin our unit on plants. we are looking forward to going to Flamingo Gardens, and then planting our own gardens. We are continuing to write narrative stories during writing time. We are focusing on writing small moments, and adding lots of detail to our pieces of writing. We are also learning to edit our work, especially by adding correct punctuation. As always, keep up the great work!



Happy November! Your second graders have been working hard and making progress. In Math, we have been focusing on place value, fact fluency, and algebra. These are the foundational skills for regrouping (carrying and borrowing). Please practice fluency and fact families with your child at home.

second Grade, We are focusing on story structure (beginning, middle, and end) in reading. Remember to listen and read with your child each night. Science has been all about matter and the scientific process. In Social Studies we've been learning about our government and the symbols we use. Reminder: Report cards go home on Wednesday, November 13. The second grade teachers thank you for all of your continued support!



Well, we just completed our first guarter and your child will be receiving his/her first report card with grades on November 13th. Please keep an eye out and read to see if your child will be invited to our first Awards Assembly. This is for all students who earn A's and B's on their report card. We strongly encourage you to Third Grade please keep practicing multiplication with your child. One great way to do this is by having your child play games on Sumdog.com. At this point in the year, your child should be able to read 30 minutes a night independently. Finally, we will be going on our first field trip in December. News will be coming home soon about the

play we will see at the Coral Springs Art Museum.



Fourth Graders are the Greatest!!! We are starting to feel like a family now. We had our first field trip together and starting to celebrate the holidays! Academically, students have really stepped up to the new expectations. We are working on writing multi-paragraph essays based on several texts. This is a complex task that requires multiple skills and maturity. Right now, we are taking it in pieces so that students understand how essays are built. By February, students will be expected to sit continuously for two hours and focus on this challenge. We look forward to seeing continuous improvement. In Reading, we are talking about the theme


of stories and moving on to perspective and point of view. We are deep into fiction and appreciate all the home support that keeps children reading. Science is moving from Life Science into Earth Science. Be ready to talk about rocks, minerals, erosion, the solar system, and the movement of Earth. Math is moving into long division. This is a new concept for our tribe, and repetition is the name of the game. Daily practice of facts and skills with multiplication and subtraction will give your child a good foundation as we move into this chapter. We are looking forward to our Thanksgiving lunch at the end of the month, we hope you will join our Parkside family that day!!

#### Counselor's Corner: November's Character Trait – Citizenship

Dear Parents, Building Resiliency in our Children!

Pain is a part of life and comes in a million different varieties, so it's important for kids to learn how to deal with it. The everyday stings of disappointment, discouragement, and frustration provide opportunities for children to build resiliency. Overprotected kids become emotionally fragile and never learn to bounce back from adversity. All parents want their children to be able to handle adversity and grow into individuals who can bounce back from tough times. Resiliency is the quality that enables them to do that. Just as we teach our children to be respectful, we also have to teach them to be resilient. When our kids learn to deal with little setbacks as they grow up, they are better prepared to deal with bigger ones later in life. We all learn how to cope through failure and mistakes. If a child never loses, she/he will never learn how to deal with loss. If they are never disappointed, the child never figures out how to deal with disappointment. If he/she is never frustrated, he/she never discovers how to overcome frustration. If the child never has to struggle, he/ she will not develop the traits of persistence and determination. Sometimes, the most uncomfortable situations present the biggest opportunities for our kids, helping them to forge the internal resources they need to succeed. Resilient children will be willing to take on big challenges and take appropriate risks because they will be less afraid than kids who have never had painful

experiences. Practicing how to handle disappointment appropriately will lead them into becoming healthy productive citizens!

1st: Juice (apple or grape), cereal, oatmeal, cookies, deodorant


2nd: canned gravy, shampoo, canned tuna/meat, canned fruit

# Aftercare Courier, November 2019

October was another great month and we are looking forward to Thanksgiving and enjoying time with family and friends. This month's payment is due Friday, November 1, 2019. If your payment is not received by this date, your child will be withdrawn from the program and you will have to re-register and pay a registration fee of \$30.00. Also, the on-line payments close out at midnight on the due date. It is an expectation of all students to practice our school wide discipline goals daily. You will be reminded of these as well each month. You can help in that area by asking your student how they go about self-monitoring themselves to make sure they are doing the right thing. Our list of 5 school wide behavior goals are:

Always Do Your Best Cooperate with others. Manage Yourself. Respect the Rights and Property of Others. Resolve Conflicts (Be a Problem Solver)



If you did not pick up a payment calendar, please ask at the aftercare desk. The afterpayments are as follows: \$194.00 for aftercare, \$48.00 for before care and 2nd sibling fee of \$184.00 Fees must be paid by the close of the day on Friday, November 1st. There are no exceptions. We have a waiting list of students who will be invited in if your spot is not secured. \*Families who received a scholarship, you can no longer pay on-line. Your payment must be made in person at the school site. If your payment is late, you will forfeit your scholarship and will have to start the process all over again.

\*\*\*If your child accidentally brings their name tag home, please put it in their backpack so that they will have it the next day. Students are required to wear name tags all day including aftercare. If you can help us out and make sure they return to school with their tag, it will help our afternoon run smoother.\*\*\*
