Administrator's Corner

February has arrived and we are ready to fill this month with lots of kindness and love. We hope you are ready to help us out! Throughout the month we have several activities and events planned for our school.

This week we celebrated the hundredth day of school. Students in the primary grades spend this day learning all about the number 100. They have been counting, sorting, eating, exercising and so much more. It is really an exciting time for these children. SO with that it means only 80 more days until the last day of school. Hard to believe how fast his year is flying by.

All of our 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students took the Broward Standard Assessments over the past two weeks. This assessment gives us information that helps teachers make adjustments to the curriculum in order to ensure all students are prepared and ready for the FSA in a few months. Once we have analyzed the results, teachers will be sharing this information with you. Please note, this assessment is completed on the computer, but the FSA will all be paper-based. Should you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact your child's teacher. We are so proud of all their hard work!

Notes from the Teachers



We have survived the first 100 days of Kindergarten! We are now in the 3rd quarter of the school year and have less than 80 days of the school year! We have our Safety Town field trip March 10-12th. Your child's teacher has the specific date for their class. In Reading, we will continue to work on distinguishing common types of texts such as storybooks, poems, etc. In Math, your child will

learn all about subtracting within 5 in chapter 6 as well as counting and recognizing numbers 11-19 in chapter 7! We will continue to work on adding so be sure to practice at home! In Science, we will focus on learning about energy and stages of matter. In writing, we will work on strengthening your child's writing skills by composing informative and explanatory topics. Please remember reading bags are to be returned to school daily and homework is due every Friday!

1st Grade

This past month, first graders have been busy reading, reading, and reading some more! As we begin the second half of the school year, reading will be our focus. The children will be taking the End of the Year Reading Test in May, and we are trying hard to get them prepared. Please be on the look-out for reading comprehension passages going home for homework. In Math, we are

finished up the chapter 5, how addition and subtraction are related. Chapter 6, Counting and Modeling Numbers, is a tough chapter, so please take time to practice math on a daily basis. Please practice math fluency facts, as well!! In science we are learning about plants. We've discussed plant parts and their jobs, how they grow and change, as well as what they need to grow. The children learned why we need plants and how they reproduce. We learned all about Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. the last couple of weeks. We discussed the importance of learning about history, and making sure we do not make the same mistakes in the future. The children are always VERY intrigued by history! In February, the children will learn about George Washington and Abraham Lincoln, as the country celebrates President's Day. As always, we thank you for being a part of your child's learning!



Second graders had an amazing Science Day! We explored Force and Motion through various experiments. Don't forget to ask your child about these experiments. They may even be able to recreate some at home. In Reading, we are working on many skills including comparing and contrasting two texts. This means your child will be expected to read two different texts and identify

how they are the same and how they are different. This important skill will help them with their reading comprehension. Second Graders are expected to be able to have reading comprehension that goes beyond retelling the events that happened in the book. They should be able to talk about character traits, the genre (fiction, nonfiction, realistic fiction, etc.), theme or lesson, make connections to their own lives, and talk about how the book is organized (including text features). These are just some of the many comprehension skills they need to grow as readers. Remember, your child should be reading every day outside of school hours. In Math, we are finishing up 2-digit subtraction and moving on to 3-digit addition and subtraction. You can help your child by having them practice addition and subtraction facts so they know them fluently. Knowing basic facts quickly will help them as the math becomes more complex. Your child can make flash cards, play math games and play games online to help improve basic fact fluency. Children can also go on the computer and use i-Ready at home to work on Reading and Math skills.



Third graders completed the Broward Standards Assessment (BSA) Tests for Reading/Language Arts and Math. Teachers are analyzing the results and planning specific lessons to prepare the students for the FSA tests. Students are becoming authors as they are completing their fictional stories about the lifecycle of a seed. These stories will be professionally published. Also, this month stu-

dents are researching their heritage and putting their information on a large 3D cube. Finally, students are learning about fractions and how they play a role in our everyday lives.

4 4 th grade

Fourth Graders have been busy learning all about fractions. We are currently working with mixed numbers and fractions greater than one to solve operations in addition, subtraction, and multiplication. We will soon be moving into decimals. In Reading and Writing we are deep in informational text. We are learning to support claims with solid reasons and evidence. We are practicing this as

writers as well as analyzing this as readers. We have grown a lot as writers, learning to polish our four paragraph essays into masterpieces! The focus of Science lately has been Earth Science. most classes have concluded their study of rocks and are moving onto the process that shape the earth like weathering, erosion, and deposition. We will start talking about the relationship between the Earth, Sun, and Moon very soon. Making observations with your child will be helpful as we begin this unit. Questions like, "Why is the Sun so low in the sky this evening? Where is the moon? How did it change its shape from last week?" will all stimulate the type of thinking needed to work through these abstract concepts. Toward the end of February many of the fourth grade students will be travelling to our oldest city, St. Augustine. We are getting ready for that trip by studying the history of the city. For those children not attending the trip, there will be a crazy critter visit!



Fifth grade students have been working very hard on their BSA tests for the past 2 weeks. They are anxious to show the wonderful academic progress they are making this year. In math they are deep into adding and subtracting fractions with unlike denominators. In reading we are finishing into point of the past of the

up main idea and diving into point of view. Students are reading literature to determine the narrator's or speaker's point of and how it influences their descriptions of events. In science we are learning about the different forms and uses of energy. Finally, the fifth grade students are working hard in their businesses to prepare for their trip to JA Biztown on February 12th.



Counselor's Corner: February's Character Trait – Honesty

Dear Parents,

REMINDER – Your words and actions affect people's self-esteem... so be KIND!

Four Ways To Help Kids Manage Frustration—Learning to manage and overcome frustrations builds resilience but it can be difficult for parents to stand back and let children cope on their own.



- 2. <u>Be Consistent</u> All children need to know that they can count on their parent to guide them, support them, take care of their essential needs, and love them. Even in times of conflict, knowing how you will act when they are upset can lead to security and comfort in the relationship.
- 3. <u>Pick the Right Time to Talk</u> You may notice that talking to your child when he or she is very emotional may not be very productive. However, children often want immediate answers and to gain what they seek instantly. It may be a relief to remember that you don't have to answer your child immediately when emotions are running high. Even if your child is frustrated it is best to wait until you are both calm to talk.
- 4. <u>Practice Good Communication Skills</u>- Listen to your child, restate your child's request and reasoning, logically explain your position, use "I" Statements... "I feel hurt when you keep leaving this mess, I want you to clean your room please.", ask your child to restate what you said

Student ID Badges



All students are **required** to wear a Parkside ID badge all day long while at school. We distribute them in the morning when they arrive and take them in the afternoon when they leave. Every teacher has 5 paper copies of the badge that students can wear if they are lost. After those have been used, there is a cost of \$5 per replacement badge. You can either pay in cash or online. Please note this will become a student obligation that will be added to the students account and this must be paid before the end of the year. If you have questions, please feel free to reach out to the school. Please remember this is a

safety issue and we must have all students, staff and visitors wearing identification at all times while on campus. Thanks for you help with this situation.

Aftercare Courier, February 2020

This month's payment is due on Friday February 7, 2020. The on-line payments close out at midnight on the due date. You can pay online or in person at the school. I will not be able to call you to remind you that your payment has not been received, so please be on time with your payment. School Board policy 3411 states that all payments MUST

be received before services are rendered. Payments are: \$194.00 for aftercare, \$48.00 for before care and 2nd sibling fee of \$184.00 Fees must be paid by the close of the day on Friday February 7th. There are no exceptions. We have a waiting list of students who will be invited in if your spot is not secured. As a reminder, families who receive a scholarship, can no longer pay on-line. Your payment must be made in person at the school site. If your payment is late, you will forfeit your scholarship and will have to start the process all over again.



***If your child accidentally brings their name tag home, please put it in their backpack so that they will have it the next day. Students are required to wear name tags all day including aftercare. If you can help us out and make sure they return to school with their tag, it will help our afternoon run smoother.

From the Aftercare Parent Handbook this month we will highlight The Discipline section: All students attending the program are expected to follow the Broward County Public Schools "Code of Student Conduct." And the anti-Bullying Policy 5.9. Inappropriate behaviors, including but not limited to, bullying and cyberbullying, are not acceptable. Students who cannot follow the daily acceptable behaviors will be placed on a "Behavior Plan." The consequences for misbehavior will vary from time out, missing an activity, suspension, or exit from the program. If a student's behavior endangers or injures another individual, the student may be immediately exited from the program.

Students who have been suspended from the program due to behavior, may not attend until the supervisor has had a conference with the student and the parent/guardian. After three documented incidents, of which the parent has been notified, a student may be exited from the program. Students suspended from the school, may not attend the program during their suspension. Fees will not be refunded for absences due to suspension. Students who are placed on "Internal Suspension" for the school day, may attend the program. As a reminder, we will continue to post our School wide behavior goals: Always Do Your Best, Cooperate with Others, Manage Yourself, Respect the Rights and Property of Others, and Try to Resolve Conflicts (Be a problem solver). Finally, please note that our Broward County Public School Tax ID # is 59-6000530.

Human trafficking is modern day slavery. It's the transporting, soliciting, recruiting, harboring, providing or obtaining of another person for the purposes of forced labor. domestic servitude or sexual exploitation using force, fraud and/or coercion.


LET'S BREAK THE CHAINS **OF SLAVERY**

Trafficking happens everywhere, but most victims are trafficked close to home, and exploiters are often fellow citizens. The most common form of trafficking reported is sexual exploitation and most survivors are female. Some under-served populations at greater risk are those who may be LGBTQ, intellectually disabled, pregnant, or young parents.
