Kindergarten

Parkside's Kindergarteners started off the year wonderfully with virtual learning!! We want to continue to thank the parents and daycare workers for their support during digital learning. We are still learning new things each day, but we're getting the hang of virtual learning. Just a reminder, in addition to the

Teams meetings, your child has assignments to complete in Canvas and Think Central while they are not actively on Teams. Soon we will begin scheduling parent-teacher conferences and administering a reading assessment to help determine your child's current reading level. Your child's teacher will contact you with more information on this! We will meet with students individually to complete this assessment. Be on the lookout for a schedule from your teacher for both conferences and reading testing. Now that we have finished our lessons on letters of the alphabet, we will begin diving into the elements of a story as well as word families. We will continue working with the numbers 1-10. Once the assessments are complete, we will begin to conduct small reading groups. We have some fun themes for our fall weeks too. If you haven't returned online forms, please do so as soon as possible! As always, please reach out to your child's teacher if you have any questions!

First Grade

Wow, we are already half way into the first quarter! First Graders have been very busy. We've been learning about respect and cooperation and have worked hard to build a virtual classroom community. This creates a positive learning environment! We completed the first math chapter on addition, and

started learning about subtraction. In Science, First Graders will begin learning about scientists. We will discuss what scientist do, and how they use their five senses to observe, discover and test. We will also take some time to familiarize ourselves with the tools they use. Lastly, we will hear about matter and the properties of matter. Writing time has been great fun as we began our unit on Narrative writing. The children are learning how to write a "small moment" writing pieces, by writing step by step and with lots of detail. Ask your child about George McClement's book, Night of the Veggie Monster. They loved it! Please be sure to read with your child nightly and have him/her share the reading strategies they are learning in class. Reading practice is the key to success!

Second Grade In Second Grade we are working hard on building our reading skills. This month we will be focusing on Story Structure, Main Idea/ Details, Understanding Characters, and Cause and Effect. Students are also using their strategies to increase their accuracy while reading. In Grammar, we are learning about Proper Nouns and Verbs. Students will be transitioning from Personal Narrative Writing to Informational Writing. In Social Studies, we are learning about our Government and Citizenship. In Science, we are investigating Properties of Matter and exploring Earth's Systems and Patterns.

Third Grade

Third Grade has been busy reading realistic fiction. We just completed a story on the Golden Gate Bridge. In Math, we are working on analyzing data using Picture Graphs, Bar Graphs and Stem plots. This requires a higher degree of problem-solving skills. Our students are LOVING sci-

ence this month. We are studying vertebrates and invertebrates. This unit will culminate with an individual report featuring a chosen animal. Finally, in Language Arts students have been busy writing compare and contrast paragraphs. Please make sure your child completes 45 minutes each week in both Reading and Math on i-Ready. Finally, we look forward to scheduling conferences soon to discuss results from recent assessments.

Fourth graders are busy this month reading novels and summarizing fictional texts. We are also diving deep into the analysis of characters as well as discussing themes in what we read. We are working on constructing quality paragraphs to share our thinking. In Math, we have moved to mul-

ti-digit multiplication and are learning several different strategies to solve problems. There are other ways than what our moms and dads learned!!! We continue to practice the skills of scientists by classifying, comparing, and measuring. We will wrap up the quarter discussing data and moving into states of matter. In Social Studies, we have spent time learning how to read maps and use longitude and latitude.

Fifth Grade

Fourth Grade

Fabulous Fifth Grade is busy fine tuning their procedures and routines, please make sure that your child is logged into Microsoft TEAMS meeting by 7:55 a.m. and ready to learn; instruction begins promptly at 8:00 a.m. It is vital that all students turn on their cameras to be an active class partici-

pant during instructional time. Students have finished their iReady math and reading diagnostic, your child's teacher will share their scores with you during conferences. Since we are now in full swing into our curriculum, please ensure that you are checking your child's work progress through each of their Canvas courses. This tool allows you to see what has been assigned, their grade, and work completion. We are finishing up place value and will begin working on division of whole numbers. All children need to know their multiplication facts fluently to be successful in math this school year, please work with them nightly using flashcards or Sumdog, if they need additional support. In Reading, we are working diligently to teach vocabulary strategies to help students determine the meaning of unknown words. In addition, we have been working on the structure of a story, learning about the theme or message and practicing making inferences based on text evidence. All students should be reading for at least twenty minutes per night; a book of their choice that is a GOOD FIT book. A GOOD FIT book is a book that there is a purpose for reading. Does it interest you, do you understand it, and do you know most of the words? In the area of Writing, we are working on using elaboration strategies to make writing our own. Elaboration will make writing come to life with juicy million dollar sentences. In Science, we are diving deep into classifying matter by physical properties. In Social Studies, students have been working on their geography skills by learning about the regions of the United States, Students created amazing projects to display their knowledge of the U.S. Have a conversation with them and ask what they have learned. Please make sure to communicate frequently with your child's teacher; it is the recipe for success!

Welcome back to a new school year and a new way of learning and interacting with each other. We are so glad that you are back!

Registration for Before and Aftercare will be done strictly on-line this school year. Please visit the BASCC website at http://www.browardschools.com/bascc to complete this. Our payments will now be done completely on-line as well. Payments will be done weekly until 🔈 we are cleared to return to our monthly schedule. Fees have increased from \$2.65 per

hour to \$3.50 per hour. It is based on a 4hour day. This is around \$14.00 per day times the number of school days in that week. A fiveday week is \$70.00. Please supply your child with snacks until we are approved for the snack program. . You must use Google Chrome. Please see the detailed instructions attached to the end of this newsletter. Once you are on the page the account name is web and just leave the password blank. You must do a different registration for each student. You cannot update an old application nor can you add a sibling. Each child has to be done separately. There is also a \$30.00 registration fee for each child. While completing the application, you will also be required to sign several pages of the Parent Handbook in order to submit it. More details about Aftercare will be shared as we approach the reopening of the school building. Become a Virtual Volunteer!

A BCPS volunteer is an individual with a sincere interest to contribute to the education of BCPS students. Volunteers actively serve during regular hours at one or more schools, several hours at a special one-time activity or event, or work on school projects at home. Two virtual volunteer opportunities are available: 1) Volunteers will use the Microsoft Teams platform to participate in live volunteer sessions. Instructions for these sessions are available at browardschools.com/volunteers. 2) Volunteers may serve as pen pals, emailing inspirational messages for school personnel to share with students. Below are guidelines for the interaction between volunteers and students in a virtual setting. School Guidelines 1) Schools will approve volunteer interaction with students and identify personnel (thereafter named "liaison") to coordinate sessions between volunteers and students. 2) Liaison will access their school's approved volunteer list to contact volunteers. 3) Liaison will schedule a convenient time for volunteers and students to meet virtually. 4) Liaison will coordinate and remain in the volunteer session for the entire meeting. NOTE: At no time will a student's contact information (including but not limited to telephone number, email address, or home address) be shared with volunteers. We love our volunteers, so please join our team here at



Code Red Drills have been mandated for all schools by the State of Florida to ensure the safety of our students and staff. These Code Red Drills will be implemented on a monthly basis, similar to fire drills. The date of the drill will not be pre-announced due to potential security and attendance issues. Instead, our school will send families Parent Link messages via phone call, text message, and/or e-mail approximately 20 minutes prior to the drill to alert everybody that it is only a drill. Our school will then send a second message to families notifying you that the drill is completed. Parkside prepares for building lock-

Counselor's Corner: October's Character Trait – Responsibility—Raising Fit Kids

Kids don't need Fad diets, radical weight-loss plans, or extreme workouts. It's the little things they do every day that make the biggest difference. With the right habits, you can keep your child healthy. The key is to make good choices part of life for the whole family - parents included.

Healthy Habit 1: Eat dinner as a family. Families who eat meals together often have a better diet and lower rates of obesity, research shows. Why? When you cook at home, you control the menu, so it's easier for everyone to eat healthy.

Healthy Habit 2: Switch off screens. When kids spend too much time watching TV, playing video games, or zoning out with a smart phone, odds are they are doing that instead of something healthier, like being active or getting enough sleep. The best way to help your child stare at screens less is for you to also limit your time with your devices. Head outside to play instead!

Healthy Habit 3: Make smart snacks the easy choice. If your fridge and pantry are stocked with nutritious stuff, you won't have to worry about keeping kids away from junk food. Keep portions of cut-up fruits and veggies, trail mix, and cheese and crackers easy for kids to find.

Healthy Habit 4: Make time for Zzz's. Tired kids are cranky and moody. And it's harder for them to have the energy to make good choices during the day. Try to stick to a routine at bedtime.

Healthy Habit 5: Be consistent. The most important way to help your family practice good habits is to stick to your plan. Stay consistent about the foods you have in the home, about family exercise, and about bedtime.



School Advisory Council (SAC): SAC is a committee of parents, community members, and teachers who meet to discuss and monitor our School Improvement Plan. The focus of SAC is primarily student achievement but many issues are discussed that affect the school. SAC has an official elected membership but all are welcome to attend each meeting.

School Advisory Forum (SAF): SAF is an open forum to discuss any school or community issue. While SAC focuses on the School Improvement Plan, SAF is the place to get more information, address any other concerns, or share ideas that impact the school. SAF has no official membership and our SAF meetings are held back to back with our SAC meetings.

How can parents get involved and participate in the SAC/SAF committee? Parents are encouraged to attend the monthly meeting of the SAC/SAF at our school, usually on the first Thursday of each month. Dear Parents,




