Administrator's Corner

We have made it into the month of February. These days seems to be moving rather quickly since we have hit 2021. For example, this week ended on the 100th day of school. This is always a milestone for our primary students who do so many things with the number 100 and our Kindergarteners dressed up today as if they were 100 years old. They were too cute. Being at the 100-day point means we have 80 days left of learning and still a lot to accomplish. Throughout the month of February, we celebrate so many things. This month is always dedicated to Black History. Of course, we as educators, teach about many influential people all year long, but try to highlight these individuals during this month. If you are looking at your child's Canvas page, each day I will be sharing some facts about a different person in Black History – facts about their life and why/how they impacted our society. Also this month, we will be focusing on Love and Service projects. Particularly next week, February 8-12, we will be doing class projects and sharing ways to give back or provide service within our school. If you remember, 3 years ago on February 14th, 2018, there was a horrific shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School where we lost several students. The following year, we started our Annual Day of Service and Love to commemorate this day. On Friday, February 12, at 10:17 am, we will have a moment of reflection for seventeen seconds. Please help to encourage your children with this task of love, service and kindness by giving them chores to do at home, maybe for you or a neighbor. Have them write notes to grandparents, aunts, uncles etc....The more we model these behaviors, the more our children will start to emulate.

The PTA will be giving out Valentine's Day goodie bags February 11-12. Our students who are participating in face to face learning will each be receiving one. The PTA hasn't forgotten the Panthers who are home elearning. If you would like to pick up your student's bag after school, they will be in the bus loop from 2:30-4:30 on those days. If you cannot make it in those hours, please contact the PTA and they will try to make arrangements for your student to get their bag. Parents, I want to readdress the COVID 19 concerns that we continue to be dealing with on a daily basis. I have tried to be as clear as I can in my communication, but we still are having weekly issues. Please see the following bullets to consider before you send your child to school.

- If someone in your home or you have been in close contact with or are being tested for COVID, please keep your child home until you receive negative results. (this could be because they were around someone who tested positive or they have had symptoms and want to check to see if it is COVID or not).
- If someone who lives in your home has tested positive, your child must quarantine for 14 days from the day of the positive result. They also must take a PCR test and show a negative result after 10 days in order to return to school.
- If your child is sent home from school from the isolation room with symptoms, he/she must go and get tested (PCR-no rapid) and have a negative result in order to return to school. If you refuse to test your child, they will have to stay out for 14 days to guarantine.
- If you take your child to get tested for whatever reason, you need to await the results, which MUST be negative, before sending your child back to school.
- If your child test positive, you MUST call and inform the school ASAP. I am in constant communication with the Health Department so I do get all of these results, but there are times where it takes a couple of days. Please make sure you call us immediately.

Some of these may seem like common sense, but every week we have had to send kids home, send letters of possible exposure and quarantine classes. In order for us to continue to manage the spread of this, we must ALL follow the protocols. We appreciate your support in helping us stop this spread. Thank you!

We continue to get more and more students back face to face and we are thankful to see these children. Please remember if you are face to face, you must be here on time daily, wear your mask at all times, and maintain social distancing throughout the day. Thank you all for all you do for our school and we are so thankful to have you partner with us in your child's education. Wishing you a LOVELY month!

It's hard to believe we are more than halfway through the school year! We hope everyone has adjusted back into the school routine after a long winter been are the whings to look for this month. You should be receiving report cards very soon on Virtual Counselor on your child's Clever dashboard. Please look for these on Wednesday February 3rd. We will also be celebrating the 100th day on Friday, February

5th. We have some fun activities planned for this day. February is also the month we celebrate Dental Health, Black History Month, and Valentine's Day. Your child's teacher will send more information about this closer to the time. In Math, we have finished up addition and subtraction. We are now starting to work on teen numbers. Please continue to read each night, practice letter/sounds and sight words, and have conversations with your children about what they are learning! This is super important to help us become better readers!



This past month, first graders have been busy reading, reading, and reading some more! As we begin the second half of the school year, reading will be our focus. The children will be taking the End of the Year Reading Test in May, and we are trying hard to get them prepared. Please be on the look-out for reading comprehension passages going home for homework in the near future! In Math, we are finished up the

chapter 5, how addition and subtraction are related. Chapter 6, Counting and Modeling Numbers, is a tough chapter, so please take time to practice math on a daily basis. Please practice math fluency facts, as well! In Science, we are learning about plants. We've discussed plant parts and their jobs, how they grow and change, as well as what they need to grow. The children learned why we need plants and how they reproduce. We learned all about Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. over the past couple of weeks. We discussed the importance of learning about history, and making sure we do not make the same mistakes in the future. The children are always VERY intrigued by history! In February, the children will learn about George Washington and Abraham Lincoln, as the country celebrates President's Day. As always, we thank you for being a part of your child's learning!



In Reading, our skills we're learning this month are Comparing and Contrasting two similar Informational texts on the same topic but different versions of the same story by different authors and/or different cultures. This important skill will continue building their reading comprehension. Second Graders should be able to discuss the different character traits and how they respond to major challenges and events, Iden-

tify the Genre (is it fiction, nonfiction, realistic fiction, hybrid etc.) or state if there a moral or lesson they learned. Make connections to their own lives and talk about how the book is organized/sections (including text features- table of contents, subheadings, captions, glossary, maps, icons, etc.). These are just some of the many FL Standards we're learning this year as they grow into detailoriented readers. Remember, your child should be reading everyday outside of school hours. In Math, we are finishing up 2-digit subtraction and moving on to 3-digit addition and subtraction. You can help your child by having them practice addition and subtraction facts, so they know them fluently. Knowing basic facts quickly will help them as the math becomes more complex. Your child can make flash cards, play math games, and play games online in (SplashLearn.com), (https:// www.prodigygame.com/ and https://www.khanacademy.org/) to help improve basic fact fluency. Children should be practicing i-Ready daily, a lesson in Reading and Math at home to continue enhancing their Reading and Math skills. In Social Studies we will be presenting the 2nd Grades 2nd Annual Outstanding Black Americans Living Museum VIRTUALLY this year - be on the lookout for the event date towards the end of the month!



Our third grade students have been very busy learning all about plants including the function of each plant part, as well as, how plants make glucose and oxygen during photosynthesis. In math, we will complete our study on division and move on to understanding fractions. If your child has NOT mastered their multiplication and division facts, we encourage you to help your child learn them. We have just complet-

ed our fifth Keystone out of 8, which works as part of our additional promotion criteria. For the next few months, we will be focusing on Reading Literary and Nonfiction passages and analyzing the various types of question stems. We ask that you encourage your child to read daily for at least 40 minutes. In the beginning of April, all students will be taking the FSA and they will be expected to read for 70 minutes during one sitting.

The second semester is an exciting one in Fourth Grade! We are putting our Reading and Language Arts skills together to become authors!!! Students are learning how to build strong multi-paragraph essays this semester. This is a challenging and very rewarding process! Our team is also excited about vocabu-

lary! We are working together with fifth graders to put on a parade at the end of the month that showcases our creative side as we stretch out of our comfort zone to use more powerful words. Science this quarter is focused on Physical Science. As we wrap up Matter, we will be moving into the topics of Energy and Magnetism. Social Studies continues to focus on the early years of our Sunshine State. Students will be learning about different explorers that laid claim to Florida. Additionally, we will be researching Black Americans this month. Math is another area that is really getting exciting! Long division is such a "grown-up" thing to learn. Kids are getting into the nitty-gritty and enjoying the success of completing these longer problems. We continue to be proud of how much growth our students have shown and how supportive our families have been!



Fifth grade t-shirt orders are out, please use the link provided by your child's teacher. All t-shirt orders are due by 2/21/2021 and orders can be placed online. Students just finished their i-ready reading and math diagnostic and will be shared by their teachers during conferences. In the area of mathematics, we are diving deep into the wonderful world of fractions. There are so many uses for fractions in the real world;

find every opportunity you can to discuss real world problems involving fractions with your child. In reading, classes are learning about multiple accounts of the same event. Ask them the difference. Our budding scientists are learning about different forms of energy and their transformations. Lastly, in Social Studies, we are obtaining knowledge of early explorers and why they traveled to the new world. We are focusing on analyzing maps and using primary and secondary sources. Please make sure students are using i -Ready reading and math for at least 45 minutes per week.

Counselor's Corner: February's Character Trait— Honesty

Dear Parents.

REMINDER – Your words and actions affect people's self-esteem... so be KIND!

Four Ways To Help Kids Manage Frustration—Learning to manage and overcome frustrations builds resilience but it can be difficult for parents to stand back and let children cope on their own.

- 1. Stay Calm while you may feel anxious, angry, or even embarrassed when your child is crying, it's important that you model remaining calm yourself. It helps to remember that being a good parent doesn't mean that your child is always happy. Remind yourself that your child's age-appropriate frustration will eventually pass and both of you will survive it.
- 2. Be Consistent All children need to know that they can count on their parent to guide them, support them, take care of their essential needs, and love them. Even in times of conflict, knowing how you will act when they are upset can lead to security and comfort in the relationship.
- 3. Pick the Right Time to Talk You may notice that talking to your child when he or she is very emotional may not be very productive. However, children often want immediate answers and to gain what they seek instantly. It may be a relief to remember that you don't have to answer your child immediately when emotions are running high. Even if your child is frustrated it is best to wait until you are both calm to talk.
- 4. Practice Good Communication Skills- Listen to your child, restate your child's request and reasoning, logically explain your position, use "I" Statements... "I feel hurt when you keep leaving this mess, I want you to clean your room please.", ask your child to restate what you said.
