Kindergarten

We can't believe we are already coming up to Spring Break and the end of the 3rd quarter! This past month, the Kindergarteners have been busy reading and working on CVC words. We will continue working on CVC words this month. Please practice writing these at home. In

Math, we have just finished up chapter 7, which is about teen numbers. We will be learning numbers up to 100 in chapter 8. Please take time to practice addition, subtraction, number recognition, and counting daily! In Science, we are looking forward to learning about the weather and living things, such as animals and plants. As always, keep reading every night and practice your child's sight words. Be on the lookout for homework in your child's folder each night as well. Thank you all so much for being a part of your child's education!

First Grade

February came and went in a snap! Thanks to all the families that made us feel super special on Valentine's Day with all the cards, flowers and gifts. It made each of us smile! The children had a blast exchanging Valentines. It was truly special to see all the children thank each

other and show their appreciation and love for their friends. In Math, we are working on reading, writing and modeling numbers from one to 120. First graders need to be able to count by 2's, 5's and 10's to 120. The children learned all about place value and are anxious to celebrate the "120 Days of School". We have been reviewing reading strategies on our CAFÉ Menu, and adding new ones every couple of weeks. In reading, we've also started some important practice for the end of the year reading test. Be on the lookout for reading passages with questions going home. These passages are similar to what will be on the test, and they are great practice! We spent a lot of time in January and February recognizing people from the past that have made an impact on our world and our lives. Ask your child to tell you about one of the historical people we learned about, and to include "facts" about what they learned. Thank you for everything you do at home to help your child continue to make progress in all the academic areas!

Hello Parents! Second grade has been busy growing and learning. Reading is so important Second Grade to your children. Take time each evening to read with your little ones. You can take turns reading and asking questions. They will remember these small moments of time spent together. Did you know you can make math fun? Take a few minutes each day to have math challenges with your children. Write 5-10 problems on a white board and take turns answering them. We encourage you to write two and three digit problems with and without regrouping (carrying and borrowing). This is a fun way for them to practice their newly learned skills. We just went in a "virtual field trip" and saw a play based on the book "The Diary of a Wombat". Ask your child about it. Although this has a been a "different" year, we want you to know that your children are happy and learning! We thank you for your continued support!

Third Grade

We are very busy in 3rd grade. We will be completing our Keystone Assessments shortly and gearing up for the FSA Reading Test the first week of April. In Math, we are beginning fractions and will be learning how to name and compare fractions. At this point in the year, we are working towards reading independently for at least 45 minutes at a time. Towards the end of March, we will focus on types of energy in Science. We ask that you continue to have your child complete 45 minutes a week for i-

Fourth Grade

Fourth Graders had a blast in the Vocabulary Parade last week and continue to work on growing their vocabulary in all subjects. In Writing, we are well into our multi-paragraph essays and beginning to write opinion pieces based on multiple sources. Reading is focused

on skills needed to analyze non-fiction texts. Students are finding main ideas, analyzing text structure, and finding evidence that authors use to support their claims about informational topics. This goes hand in hand with Science as we look at the interaction between humans and animals and the environment. Additionally in Science, we are moving toward discussions about Energy and Forces like magnetism. Our Math time is filled with fractions!!! We have learned equivalent fractions, simplest form, common denominators, and will be learning how to add and subtract fractions and mixed numbers next month! A shout out to PTA for the Valentine's treats. The kids loved them!

Fifth Grade

5th graders have been hard at work! All of the students have been learning about famous African Americans and their contributions to the world during the month of February. In addition, our budding writers have been working on creating multi-paragraph essays using

their elaboration to make their essays come to life. In Reading, we are wrapping up working on multiple accounts of the same event, there are so many juicy stories to look at from various perspectives. As we move on in Math, we continue to work on fractions. We are multiplying fractions and learning how to solve problems in the real world. In the wonderful world of Science, we are learning about electricity! We will conduct online investigations using circuits to determine how energy flows. Counselor's Corner: March's Character Trait—Self-Control

- 9 Calm Down Ideas for Kids
- 1. Go outside and kick a ball or run around: the physical activity is great outlet for overwhelming emotions and nature is a great healer.
- 2. Punch a pillow: A safe way to let off steam when managing angry or frustrated feelings.
- 3. Listen to music or sing a song: good for children who find music comforting
- 4. Close your eyes and think of a calm place: a great relaxation tool for kids, this is one to practice with them at other times (before sleep is a great time) so that they can call on it when they are struggling with emotions
- 5. Draw a picture: encourage your child to use their creativity to symbolically represent how they are feeling
- 6. Write a letter or a story: this technique provides a creative outlet for their feelings
- 7. Read a book: reading may provide a sense of relief from other pressures
- 8. Talk to someone: talking to a friend may help your child when struggling with big emotions, this support van help them process what they are feeling
- 9. Ask for a hug: some children will find comfort in close physical contact when they are feeling overwhelmed

School Advisory Council (SAC): SAC is a committee of parents, community members, and teachers who meet to discuss and monitor our School Improvement Plan. The focus of SAC is primarily student achievement but many issues are discussed that affect the school. SAC has an official elected membership but all are welcome to attend each meeting.

School Advisory Forum (SAF): SAF is an open forum to discuss any school or community issue. While SAC focuses on the School Improvement Plan, SAF is the place to get more

information, address any other concerns, or share ideas that impact the school. SAF has no official membership and our SAF meetings are held back to back with our SAC meetings.

How can parents get involved and participate in the SAC/SAF committee? Parents are encouraged to attend the monthly meeting of the SAC/SAF at our school, usually on the first Thursday of each month. This year the school does not have water fountains for the students to use. We do, however, have filling stations for students to fill and refill their water bottles. The problem is the students are not bringing in bottles. Please pack a cup or a water bottle in your child's backpack so that they can have water whenever they want it.

The county is now providing snack and supper bags to our students. They now have the opportunity to receive these each day of aftercare. Lastly, they can bring books in their backpack to read or word search items to do when homework is done. Stay safe!
