Kindergarten Hello families! We can't believe this crazy year is officially coming to an end. We have a lot to look forward to in the month of May. In Math, we are wrapping up 2-D and 3-D shapes and moving into measurement. Please continue working on simple addition and subtraction facts! In Reading, please continue practicing CVC words, sight words, and of course, read with your child each night! We will begin administering the reading assessment in the middle of May. They need to know all 52 letters and 26 sounds. In Science, we are going to be learning about plants and life cycles. These Kindergarteners have grown so much this year and we thank you for supporting all of us and your children in this journey. We wish you all a happy, relaxing, safe summer!!

> Is it May, already? It's hard to believe, but the school year is nearing the end!! In Math, we learned to compare numbers and use the correct math symbol to show what we know. In the coming weeks, the children will learn to use a standard ruler to measure

items in inches and centimeters, tell time to the hour and half hour, be able to collect data and graph information using various types of graphs, and count money. We have been practicing many of these skills at calendar math throughout the year, so many of the children will breeze through this information. In Science, the children learned about gravity, magnets, microscopes, and force and motion. We are going to study about the earth's resources, and some landforms and how they change either fast or slow. We will also investigated natural and manmade resources. First graders will stay on the right "direction" as we begin learning about maps and how useful they are in our everyday lives. You will be able to ask your child to tell you about a compass rose, or maybe how a map key is used. The will enjoying discovering maps and learning where other places are located in comparison to where we live.

Lastly, we hope you'll continue to encourage your child to read nightly! The more they practice, the more fluent they will become!

Second Grade Yay! We made it to the end of the year. WE CAN VIRTUALLY DO ANYTHING! This year has taught us a lot about perseverance, flexibility, and thinking outside the box to solve problems. We have successfully completed the End-of-the-Year Reading Test. The End-of-the-Year Math Test is coming soon. Our End of 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade celebration outside day will be on June 3rd. More information will be coming soon through email. Here are some summer suggestions to get ready for 3<sup>rd</sup> grade- Keep a journal of your thoughts, practice addition and subtraction facts using flash cards, get a head start on multiplication facts, look into summer reading challenges at your local library, KEEP ON READING EVERYDAY! Have fun this summer, go outside and play, and stay safe.

As we head toward summer, we will have a very busy month of May. The first two weeks of May we will completing end-of-the-year assessments to determine promotion. In addition, we will be working on new modules regarding mental health and

relaxation exercises. We will continue to work on our multiplication and division facts because this is a necessity in 4th grade. Many classes will be doing novel studies and/or more hands-on activities. In the near future, you will be getting information regarding summer school and who will be eligible. We ask that you continue to have your child read daily.

Fourth Grade Fourth graders have been on fire this Spring!!! We are reading machines attacking nonfiction texts about many different topics. We have analyzed authors claim and evidence, as well as the visual supports included in their pieces. A few classes have started dabbling with poetry too! In Science, we continue to study natural resources, both renewable and non renewable as well as rocks and minerals. We are having fun with decimals and geometry in Math as we start to wrap up and review for our year-end assessments. It is incredible how hard working and focused this 2020-2021 group has been. We are so proud of them!!

#### Counselor's Corner Reducing Test Taking Anxiety

Test anxiety is when a student excessively worries about doing well on a test. This can become a major hindrance on test performance and cause extreme nervousness and memory lapses among other symptoms. The following are tips to reduce test taking anxiety.

- Being well prepared for the test is the BEST way to reduce test taking anxiety
- Space out your studying over a few days or weeks and continually review class material. Don't try to learn everything the night before.
- Try to maintain a positive attitude while preparing for the test and during the test.
- Exercise for a few days before the test will help reduce stress.
- Get a good night's sleep before the test.
- Show up to class early so you won't have to worry about being late.
- Read the directions slowly and carefully
  - Stay relaxed, if you begin to get nervous this is ok. Your body is telling you this is important. Take a few deep breaths slowly to relax yourself and then get back to work.
  - Stay focused and don't worry about other students finishing before you.
  - Remember positive self talk... "I can do this." "I am prepared."

## **Panther Aftercare News**

Payment reminder: We have 3 payments left for the school year. Payments are due Sunday May 2nd by 11:59pm. This payment will cover May 3-14th. The following payment is due on May 16th by 11:59 pm. It will cover May 17th – 28th. And the final payment of the year is due Sunday May 30th. This last payment will be for 7 days + 2 hours for the early release day. It covers June 1st – 9th. News for next school year: Before and Aftercare will be re-



turning to our 18 day (monthly) pay schedule! Payment dates will be posted as well as given to each parent. If your payment is not received by the due date, you will be charged an additional \$30.00 reregistration fee per child. We did not do that this year but, we will return to it next school year. The fees will also go back to \$2.65 per hour instead of the \$3.50 per hour that we are paying this year.

State Testing will take place at Parkside in April and May. If you are the parent of a 3rd, 4th or 5th grader, you should have received a letter informing you about our testing procedures. If not, you can view these letters on our web site. Students who are learning virtually, will come to school to take the test on the assigned days. If you plan on staying longer than the testing times for that day, please let your child's teacher know so we can plan for adequate safety and spacing considerations. On the days that your child is expected

to be testing, they must be in school for the test in order to be marked present.
