Welcome Back to the 2021-2022 school year! We are so very excited to have so many of our students returning and many new friends joining us this year. There are also several faces that were with us last year that we are finally getting to meet for the first time. We want to take a minute and thank you for entrusting us with your children each and every day. We are so very thankful they are all back with us here at the school. It is that time of year again and the second grade teachers are so excited to see everyone face to face this year. We know it has been challenging but we can get through it. This year we have lots of exciting events and field trips planned. Make sure to check out your teacher's communication app,

sign all required papers for school, bring in your school supplies, and get involved. Don't forget to take a look at your teacher's wish list. All help is greatly appreciated.



We are so excited to have our students back face to face! The month of September will be a very busy one. First, each teacher will be assessing all the students in reading and math using I-Ready, BAS, and a math Prerequisite Test. As soon as we have gathered data to determine areas of strength and areas that need improvement, we will begin conferences. This month our reading focus is story struc-

ture focusing on characterization, sequencing, and problem/solution in the genre of fiction. It is imperative that our students read a minimum of 20 minutes a day. In math, we will learn how to estimate or round to the nearest ten and hundred, as well as, review addition and subtraction requiring regrouping. Science is an exciting time for students this month because our focus in on animal classification and its interaction with the environment. Finally, in social studies we will begin with reading, using, and designing maps. Your child will have homework each night, Monday-Thursday. It is essential that each child complete it nightly. We will work TOGETHER to make sure we have a FABULOUS year!



Fourth Grade is extremely excited to be back to face-to-face learning. This group of fourth graders are special and are just as elated to be back at school as the teachers are. We are starting the year by sharing novels together. Through these novels, students learn about the elements of fictional literature, the development of a character, summarizing, and theme. We continue to enjoy beautiful picture

books as well to develop our vocabulary and recognition of figurative language. Our grammar focus is identifying types of nouns and using correct capitalization. We are beginning in place value in math and we are using a variety of tools to practice decomposing and analyzing numbers to the hundred thousands. Also, we are working on committing our multiplication facts to memory. Again, students may choose different tools to practice their facts. Our focus in Social Studies right now is geography and map skills. In Science we are learning about the skills scientists use such as observing, inferencing, classifying, comparing, communicating, and using data. We are looking forward to a great year!



The Fabulous Fifth Graders are so excited to be back in face to face school. They are busy fine tuning their procedures and routines and getting familiar with their new teacher and classmates. It is the second week of school and we are now in full swing into our curriculum. In reading we are learning about inside and outside character traits and teaching vocabulary skills to determine the meaning of unknown words. In math we have begun with place value of whole numbers and multiplication. In sci-

ence we are diving into the Nature of Science and learning how scientists conduct investigations. The fifth-grade teachers are looking forward to Open House on Wednesday, September 1 at 7:00 PM. We are excited to talk about this year's exciting curriculum.

School Counselor's September Snapshot



A new school year has arrived and while it's a busy time for all, it's important to remember that the WELLBEING of SELF should always remain priority. Mindfulness is a form of self-care that has become quite popular in our society. The concept of Mindfulness is developing intrapersonal (i.e. self) awareness/engagement to reduce overall stress and add resiliency to one's personality.

The basis of Mindfulness is taking a few minutes each day to silence typical, divergent thought patterns and to shift the mindset to focus on the "here and now." Hence, when one allows ONLY the "here and now" to be of concern, one is helping to calm one's mind and body. Moreover, various

research has shown that when the mind and body are calm, one can engage in and learn more from the given moment. Eventually, with consistent practice, Mindfulness has been said to enhance one's ability to manage life events with more confidence and positivity.

The Broward County Public School District encourages Social Emotional Learning via the Mindfulness concept. Social Emotional Learning incorporates the intrapersonal (i.e. self) awareness/engagement component of Mindfulness AND combines it with an interpersonal (i.e. self with others) awareness/engagement component. Take a Family Meal as an example...Assign each family member a duty (e.g. meal idea planning, shopping for food items, preparing/cooking items, setting out eating utensils, consolidating left-overs, cleaning the dishes, etc.) After the meal experience is complete, have a family discussion noting the effect of each person's cooperation ---or lack thereof—on the family meal experience.
