Kindergarten

It's hard to believe it is already the 2nd quarter. We will really be focusing on blending letter sounds and sight word recognition. Reading fluency is a big confidence builder with the young readers, and the more they are exposed and feel comfortable starting to read independently the better they will do. In Math, we will be comparing numbers up to 10. Please make sure to review the math vocabulary with your child. (Greater, less than, equal). In Science, we will be learning about plant life cycles which is always a fun unit! We will continue to talk a lot about family traditions and comparing families of today with those in the past during this month. We're excited for the holidays coming up so we wish a very Happy Thanksgiving to you and your families!

First Grade

We have been very busy in First Grade. Reading groups are in full swing and the children are working hard learning reading strategies to make them better readers. Please take some time to read the Parent Pipelines we send home. They are full of information that can help you help your child with reading at home. In Math, we have completed the chapters on addition/subtraction concepts, and are now learning about different strategies to help us solve a problem. We are also working hard on math fluency to ten, as well as doubles and doubles plus one facts. In Science, the students have learned about scientist tools, their five senses, and the scientific method. The students will be learning about plants and how they grow during November! We will be going to Flamingo Gardens to explore more about plants. We are continuing to write narrative stories during writing time. We are focusing on writing small moments, and adding lots of detail to our pieces of writing. We are also learning to edit our work, especially by adding correct punctuation. As always, keep up the great work!

Second grade is sailing smoothly into second quarter. We had our Halloween Parade on Oct 29. It was nice to return to some traditional activities. We had some fun dressing up for Red Ribbon Week at the end of October and most classes took on Ms. Mastrianni's No Pa-

per Day challenge and entered the recycled animal art contest! In Reading, we are learning to retell and summarize stories including folktales and fables and determine the moral or lessons they try to teach. In Math, we are learning about place value and different ways to add two and three digit numbers. Math fact fluency is key to making this process easier. Please practice your math facts at home daily using flashcards or flashcard apps. Remember to spend some time on iReady for Reading and Math each day for a total of 45 min each week per subject. In Social Studies, we are learning about various Native American regions and the tribes living in each region including the types of homes, clothing and lifestyle. We are also learning how immigrants or settlers affected the Native American way of life. In science we are learning about Earth Systems and Patterns in Nature including severe weather conditions and how we can prepare for them. Wishing everyone a safe and happy Thanksgiving this month.

Third Grade this month, we will be been working hard on many activities. Students need to be able to do a Close Read, which means they should be going back in the text and underlining the responses to questions after reading the text three times, as well as answering in complete sentences with capital letters, and punctuation. Please check your student's homework daily to ensure completion. We will be continuing doing Multiplication. It is imperative that students learn their facts and have automaticity. Math builds on having this foundation throughout the year, and onward. Also, we will be working on Plants, and the Life Cycle in Science. In Social Studies, we will be continuing our Map skills and working on cultures around the world. Don't forget, it is necessary for all students to have forty-five minutes of iReady for each subject per week. Make it a great month!

This past October has a been a fun month of learning. In Reading, we are working on summarizing and point of view. Students are learning the difference between first and third point of view. Our grammar focus has been on distinguishing the use of different homophones such as "there, their, they're" and "your, you're." In Math we are working on multiplying two-digit numbers by two-digit numbers as well as learning about factors and multiples. Students are using multiplication strategies such as distributive property, partial products, and the regrouping method. As we move through our lessons we continue to work on mastering our multiplication facts. In Science, we just recently finished learning about food chains. Students learned about food chains found in the Everglades. We are excited to see these animals when we go on our field trip to the Everglades in November! Currently, we are learning about reproduction of plants and life cycles. Many teachers have brought in habitats of beetles and butterflies to bring learning more to life. We are excited to see what November holds!

We can't believe that it is November already. Time is sure flying in 5th grade! The students are excited to participate in the GRADE program with Officer Mulvey, where they will be learning important lessons about topics such as cyberbullying, gangs and drugs. The Fifth

Grade has just completed division of whole numbers and are jumping into adding and subtracting decimals. In Science, we will be finishing up with weather and moving on to matter. The students have been working hard on their Native American projects in Social Studies, along with their weekly geography activities. Finally, in Language Arts, we are busy planning essays using two sources and reading literature to compare and contrast characters, plot, and settings. Please make sure your child is reading for at least 20 minutes per day to increase their fluency, vocabulary and comprehension skills. Reading is the center of All Learning!

School Counselor's Corner

Thanksgiving is within sight and the Parkside staff is very thankful to be a part of your child(ren)'s educational journey. The collection for the annual Harvest Drive is underway and will continue up until 8am on November 15, 2021. Certain non-perishable items have been requested by the Harvest Drive organizers. Hello from the PTA and Happy November!


