Administrator's Corner

Welcome back Parkside Families to the 2022/23 school year. We are excited to get this year started and looking forward to s successful year. We'd like to welcome back so many of our returning families and are happy to have so many new Kindergarten families as well as other grade levels. Please know we are glad to have you as part of our family.

This year our theme is Exploring to the Stars. Our focus will be looking to dig deeper into our curriculum, with a focus on Science. Our teachers have been working tirelessly over these last few weeks and through the summer training and planning for this upcoming year. We want your children to love learning and to have learning experiences that are hands on, engaging, enriching and fun. Parents will learn more about what is happening in the classrooms at our two Open Houses.

On the first day of school, we sent home several different forms that we need you to please take time to fill out and return to school. The emergency contact forms (green card stock) is very important for us so we have updated information for you and your families. Should we ever have an emergency, these are the cards we physically take with us. The other really IMPORTANT form this year is new. This is form is called "Parent/Guardian Consent For School Health Services." This is imperative we receive one of these for every child in order for them to be seen in our clinic. If your child does not have a form completed, he/she will not be able to be seen for any reason. Please take a few minutes to complete and turn these in to us as soon as you can.

We really want to thank you all for a great start this year. The routines and procedures for our arrival and dismissal have been running fairly smoothly. Just a few reminders for all. If you are walking your child to and from school, please remember you are required to use the crosswalks at all times. We understand that this may make you walk a little further, but you and your child's safety is first and foremost. In our car loop, please continue to remember you must pull all the way forward every time you are dropping off or picking up. This helps us to load and unload multiple cars at a time and get through faster. If your child needs assistance, please let the safety patrol or one of the adults assist you if needed.

This year we will implementing a Progress Monitoring System called FAST, Florida Assessment of Student Thinking. This will be implemented three times throughout the year. The final PM will be used for promotion criteria and as well as the school accountability grade. The school grade will begin next school year as this year is considered a "held harmless" year since it's the first time giving this type of assessment. All assessments will be computer based. The first PM will window is August 16th-September 26th. So we have scheduled these for the week of September 6th for grades 3-5 and September 12th for K-2. More information is on the website and will be coming home soon. Should you have any additional questions, please reach out to your child's teacher.

Your child has been learning and slowly adapting to the new routines and procedures in first grade. It is amazing to see the progress that has taken place in such a short time. Keep up the awesome work, families! We have also been spending time getting to know each other and making our classrooms feel like home. We look forward to a fantastic year! Welcome back Second Graders! We are so excited to start the new year. Open House is on Wednesday, August 31 at 6:30. Hope to see all parents there. Your teacher will be discussing their schedule, expectations, the new math series, and plenty more. Make sure to order your child's Second Grade t-

shirt. Order form went home electronically through your teacher's communication app. Please read the directions on how to order on the form. If you have any questions, please contact your child's teacher.



Third Grade has made their launch to the stars with abundant enthusiasm! We have a lot of new experiences in store for our students this year. After a couple of weeks of acclimating our newly intermediate Panthers to classroom rules and procedures, we dive right into a brand-new Math curriculum

focusing strongly on the problem-solving process and the understanding of using the mathematical concepts in reallife settings. In Reading, students will be reviewing basic skills for the first few weeks while teachers give each student a BAS testing to gauge their jumping off point since the end of the last school year. After Labor Day we begin our Benchmark Advance series in Reading and Writing. All standard assessments this year will be online at school and more periodic, so as to monitor the progress closely of each student. As soon as we have gathered data to determine areas of strength and areas that need improvement, we will begin conferences. It is imperative that our students read a minimum of 20-30 minutes per day. Your child's teacher may also be asking for a log of hat he/she has read. In Math, we will begin with initial multiplication concepts and properties. Science is an exciting time for students this month because our focus is on animal classification and its interaction with the environment. Finally, in Social Studies we will journey into reading, using, and designing maps. Your child will have homework each night, Monday-Thursday. It is essential that each child complete it nightly. PLEASE check your child's Agenda and HOME FOLDER every day after school so as to maintain communication between home and the classroom. We will work TOGETHER to make sure we have a STELLAR year!



Fourth Grade is extremely excited to be back in school. We are starting the year by sharing novels together. Through these novels, students learn about the elements of fictional literature, the development of a character, summarizing, and theme. We continue to enjoy beautiful picture books as well to de-

velop our vocabulary and recognition of figurative language. Our grammar focus is identifying types of nouns and using correct capitalization. We are beginning in place value in math and we are using a variety of tools to practice decomposing and analyzing numbers to the hundred thousands. Also, we are working on committing our multiplication facts to memory. Again, students may choose different tools to practice their facts. Our focus in Social Studies right now is geography and map skills. In Science, we are learning about the skills scientists use such as observing, inferencing, classifying, comparing, communicating, and using data. We are looking forward to a great year!



Fifth Grade is extremely excited to begin this year. We are so elated to see all the students smiling faces and their eagerness to learn. We are starting the year in reading with our first novel, Frindle. We are learning about author's purpose, and what it means to be a successful reader. In writing, we are working on finding the main idea and evidence of a text which will help us organize our writing especially

when doing essays. We are working on place value in math and are using a variety of tools to practice decomposing and analyzing numbers from the hundred millions to the thousandths place. Our focus in Social Studies right now is geography of the United States and map skills such as latitude and longitude. We are becoming scientists and learning the scientific process as well as making observations and inferences. We are looking forward to a great year!

September Counselor's Corner



There are two school counselors at Parkside Elementary this year! Nicole Hahn has joined the Parkside team and will be working alongside Tracy Cerra in ensuring the social and emotional health of Parkside's students and families. While the start of a new school year is a busy time for all, it's important to remember that the WELLBEING of SELF should always remain priority. Mindfulness is a form of self-care that has become quite popular around in our society. The concept of Mindfulness is developing intrapersonal (i.e. self) awareness/engagement in order to reduce overall stress and add resiliency to one's persona.

The basis of Mindfulness is taking a few minutes each day to silence typical, divergent thought patterns and to shift the mindset to focus on the "here and now." Hence, when one allows ONLY the "here and now" to be of concern, one is helping to calm one's mind and body. Moreover, various research has shown that when the mind and body are calm, one can engage in and learn more from the given moment. Eventually, with consistent practice, Mindfulness has been said to enhance one's ability to manage life events with more confidence and positivity.

The Broward County Public School District encourages Social Emotional Learning via the Mindfulness concept. Social Emotional Learning incorporates the intrapersonal (i.e. self) awareness/engagement component of Mindfulness AND combines it with an interpersonal (i.e. self with others) awareness/engagement component.
