

<u>PRINCIPAL'S GREETING</u>
Safety continues to be our highest priority. Thank you for all of your support with our new procedures. We raised \$1,700 for MSD between the MSD Day and the Chorus fundraiser. We are in the process of evaluating our building to continue to improve our safety practices. We are also looking into getting i.d. badges for our students as every Broward County Public School student and staff are required to wear badges. Please keep our front loop clear and do not park in the Fire Lane. After April 15th, police will be writing tickets across the county. We will be discussing school safety at every SAC meeting. Please come and let your voice be heard! We will also be having a Cyber Bullying parent training on April 18th at 6:30pm. Come learn how to keep your children safe on the internet.

April is a busy testing month! We have implemented many interventions this year to help all children succeed. The different grades have met to analyze data, monitor progress, plan instructional focus calendars, enrich, and remediate all students. We are a team and have worked to accomplish our main goal, an increase in student achievement. You are a part of the game plan and should reinforce with your children to "Be All You Can Be at PPE, Mission Possible!"

Remember that a test is like a snapshot. It is a one-time look at a child's performance. All children have skills and knowledge that tests do not measure. A single test score **does not** tell you everything about a child. Thank you for your cooperation this month by bringing your child(ren) to school on time and ready to "show what they know!" If a child arrives late on a test day, he or she will not be able to enter his or her classroom until the "all clear" for testing is made. Please help us by having your child(ren) here on time.

TITLE I UPDATE

The SPAR contains several types of data designed to inform parents about the progress of Florida's public schools. Plantation Park Elementary has Improvement Plan (SIP) that solicits input from students, parents, guardians, and staff throughout the school year to ensure your child receives the best education possible with supports in place. The SIP is a document that reflects, in part, barriers that can adversely impact your child's education. As stakeholders, we develop a plan that brings forth best practices that will help your child succeed. If you would like a copy, it can be located at the front desk for your review.

In addition to the school's SIP, the District's Local Education Agency Parent Plan can also be accessed at the front desk for your review. We are currently developing our School Parent and Family Engagement Plan for next year. Come to our monthly SAC meetings to provide input!

MIDDLE SCHOOL PLANNING

A quick note for the parents/guardians of 5th graders. We automatically assign students to their zoned middle school through the District database. If you requested a reassignment or applied for a magnet program and have received a letter of acceptance, please be sure to provide Mrs. Miles with a copy. If you did not make the deadline for reassignment, you have a second opportunity on May 1st. Your child could be selected for any spots that may be remaining. It is important for you to tell us where your child is going to Middle School if it is not the District-zoned school. APRIL IS A BIG TESTING MONTH

Stress and anxiety are very normal parts of life and it is critical that our children find healthy ways to manage them. At this time of the year, students may experience heightened anxiety before a testing situation. A certain degree of test anxiety is normal and may help students prepare more effectively, work more efficiently, and remain focused during testing. Too much anxiety, however, can negatively affect performance. The following strategies may assist in reducing test anxiety.

Student Strategies for Reducing Test Anxiety:

- Share your feelings of anxiety with parents and teachers.
- Think of the test as an opportunity to show what you know. Just do your best!
- Relax, breathe deeply, and stay focused on the test.

Parent Strategies for Reducing Test Anxiety:

- Discuss the test openly and in a positive
- Have realistic expectations of your child while encouraging his/her best efforts.
- Emphasize that the test is only one measure of academic performance and does not determine a person's self-worth.

 Parent Testing Day Support Strategies:

- See that your child is rested and eats breakfast.
- See that your child arrives at school on time.
- Encourage your child to try his/her best.
- Do not send your child to school if ill.
- Do not remove your child from school on test days for appointments.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

If your child is found to have an electronic device that reproduces, transmits, calculates or records (i.e. cell phone, camera or pager) in his or her pocket, at his or her desk, or within his or her reach during testing, the test will be invalidated. Leave them at home during testing. If you have questions please contact our Testing Coordinator, Mrs. Miles.
