AGENDA BOOKS / TAKE HOME FOLDERS
Students in grades 1st-5th will receive an agenda book. We ask that you initial the agenda book daily. This will also be used as a communication tool between parents and teachers.

Students in grades PreKDG-5th will have a folder to take items back and forth weekly. It is very important that you check your child's take home folder every Wednesday. If they lose or damage their folder, they may purchase a similar one from the store. Disclaimer: Sometimes it may be necessary to send home papers on other days (i.e. interim reports, report cards, etc).

VOLUNTEER PROCEDURES

Keeping students safe is a priority. When school opens, STAR (Security Tracking And Response) will continue to be used at all schools. The STAR System provides schools with high-speed security checks against local, state and national sex offender databases and against state and local law enforcement files. When visitors come to school, the office staff will swipe their driver's license, verify the name, take a photo and print a badge.

Volunteers must complete the on-line application before helping in any school. http://browardschools.com/getinvolved to complete the application. The first time volunteers come to assist, the front office will ask for the identification used in the online application. Volunteers who provided service throughout the 2018/19 school year with an ACTIVE status (as recorded in the STAR system), may have been automatically screened for Level 1 clearance for the 2019/20 school year. Please contact the school office to receive your 2019/20 volunteer badge. If you do not have access to a computer or you need assistance with the online application, let us know!

FREE BREAKFAST

The Breakfast Program is still being offered FREE in all Broward County Schools. This allows all students to participate at no charge, regardless of the student's meal eligibility. The overall goal is to increase student academic achievement, while supporting student performance. Our cafeteria will be open for breakfast from 7:25am-7:55am.


PARENT GROUPS

Parent involvement at Plantation Park is critical to our success. Get involved this year in our many parent groups. We welcome new ideas!

- 1. Parent Teacher Association (PTA) serves as a type of forum where parents, teachers, administrators, and other concerned adults discuss supporting a quality education, and encourage community involvement.
- Plantation Park Singers Booster Association (PPSBA) is a not-for-profit organization for the Plantation Park Singers Chorus. Membership is free. The purpose is to make chorus the highest quality educational experience possible for the children by handling non-musical aspects of running a choir.
- School Advisory Forum (SAF) functions as a liaison between the school, the community, and the district. The School Advisory Forum provides parents, citizens, teachers, and students an opportunity to participate in the development of educational priorities, policies, assessment of school needs, and the identification of local resources.
- School Advisory Council (SAC) consists of elected parents, teachers, non-instructional representatives, community representatives, and the principal. SAC meets at various times during the school year to discuss the school's programs, achievements, goals, and needed improvements.

CAFETERIA REMINDER

Did you know that you can add money to your child's school meal accounts via the internet? This website accepts credit cards for payment into student meal accounts. You can also stay up-todate with your child's spending in the cafeteria by seeing what your child has purchased. In addition, you can receive notifications, so you no longer have to worry about your child's account balances. Go to *myschoolbucks.com*. You can link from our website and/or download the app.



FREE AND REDUCED APPLICATIONS

<u>www.myschoolapps.com</u> is the only way for parents to submit free and reduced applications. If you need help, please contact the school and we will help you. You will need the following: name and income of every member of your household and the school, grade, student number, and birthdate of every student in your household. Children who do not attend Broward County Public Schools should be listed under the "Household Members" section, last four digits of your Social Security Number if you have one, a phone number in case we have to contact you for information, and a valid e-mail address for you to receive notification of your child's meal benefits. All applications must be done on the computer. PPE will have access for parents to complete the online application here or you can call the department at 754-321-0215. It is best to complete your application within the first ten days of school!

ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY

Throughout the year, the School Board of Broward County have performed a substantial number of asbestos abatement projects. INSTRUCTIONAL FOCUS

PPE has established a school procedure of "Do Not Disturb" instruction time. Research shows that if a student is distracted and loses focus, it takes twice as long to refocus the child. Therefore, we will not interrupt instruction unless it is an emergency. Please remember to give your child his/her lunch, ice-cream money, and any special message he/she may need before school begins. Thank you for helping keep our students on task!

FIRST DAY PACKETS

Please return your first day packets by <u>August 30th</u>. We need to have several of the forms included in the packet in case of an emergency. Also, please notify the school during the year if your phone number(s) / address changes!

ATTENDANCE POLICY

A strategic goal of Broward Schools is expecting all students will achieve their highest potential. order for your child to be successful in school, he or she needs to attend school every day. Policy 5.5, Attendance, states both excused and unexcused absences along with tardiness and early sign-outs will be counted when determining a student's pattern of non-attendance. A student has a "pattern of non-attendance" if he or she is absent from school a total of 30 hours (5 days) in any one marking period or 60 hours (10 days) within 90 days. If a child has unexcused absences, excused absences without acceptable documentation, tardies or early sign-outs that add up to a "pattern of non-attendance," and it is clear that the absences are a sign of early truant behavior, consequences may be imposed. In the event your child accumulates numerous absences or tardies, you may be contacted to discuss a solution. If you have questions, please call Mrs. DeMeo, Assistant Principal.

TITLE I

According to the U.S. Department of Education the purpose of Title I funding, "is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education and reach, at minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments." The basic principles of Title I state that schools will receive supplemental funds to assist in meeting students' educational goals. The number of students enrolled in the free and reduced lunch program determines low-income students. For an entire school to qualify for Title I funds, at least 50% of students must enroll in the free and reduced lunch program. Plantation Park is currently a Title I school. BCPS MOBILE APP

The Broward County Public Schools Mobile App is available to download to your mobile device. This app includes an option for parents to log in and review transportation, food and nutrition, and academic information for your child. Registration is required to ensure parents are given safe and secure access. You will be able to receive information in the way you want it: text, email, or by phone. As a school, we will be able to send alerts and notifications anytime, anywhere, to parents using a smart phone or tablet. Download the app at the App Store or on Google Play.

EARLY DISMISSAL

Early dismissal should be avoided. No child will be released from school between 1:40 PM and 2:10 PM without administrative approval. We ask parents to make doctor and dental appointments after school hours whenever possible. Only parent/guardian or persons listed on the school emergency form are permitted to sign out students. For security reasons, we do not accept telephone requests or notes from parents to release students from school; they must be picked up by parent/guardian. Students will not be called to the office until parent/guardian arrives with proper identification.
