#### COMING TO PPE 2018-2019

Next year we will be starting a Debate Club at PPE! Speech and debate students learn research, logic, organization of ideas, manipulation of language, assessment of audience, self-esteem and engagement in world events.

We are also bringing Zones of Regulation to PPE schoolwide. "Life is 10% what happens to us and 90% how we react to it." Self-regulation is something everyone continually works on whether or not we are cognizant of it. We all encounter trying circumstances that test our limits from time to time. If we are able to recognize when we are becoming less regulated, we are able to do something about it to manage our feelings and get ourselves to a healthy place. This comes naturally for some, but for others it is a skill that needs to be taught and practiced. This is the goal of The Zones of Regulation.
