Families have access to a website that introduces i-Ready and explains how parents can support and encourage your child's success. Many resources are located in the Family Center including log-on tips and ways to motivate your child. Check it out at: https://login.i-ready.com/

Your child should be able to log-on using his/her Single Sign-On (SSO) account to access i-Ready. The user id# is the student number and the password is Pmm/dd/yyyy. You can also access i-Ready on an iPad. Students can download the i-Ready iPad app on supported iPads for access to K-5 reading instruction and K-1 math instruction.

EARLY LITERACY

Literacy is the ability to read independently, write clearly, and understand and create information in different forms of media. Students come to kindergarten with a wide variety of backgrounds and abilities. Our approach to reading is known as Balanced Literacy. It begins with phonics, continues with guided reading, and then uses content-based and fiction texts for independent reading. We monitor the development of students' reading skills with running records until students independent readers. Our expectation is that all students will be independent readers by the end of third grade, in alignment with the national standard.
