2:38pm- Parent Pick-Ups

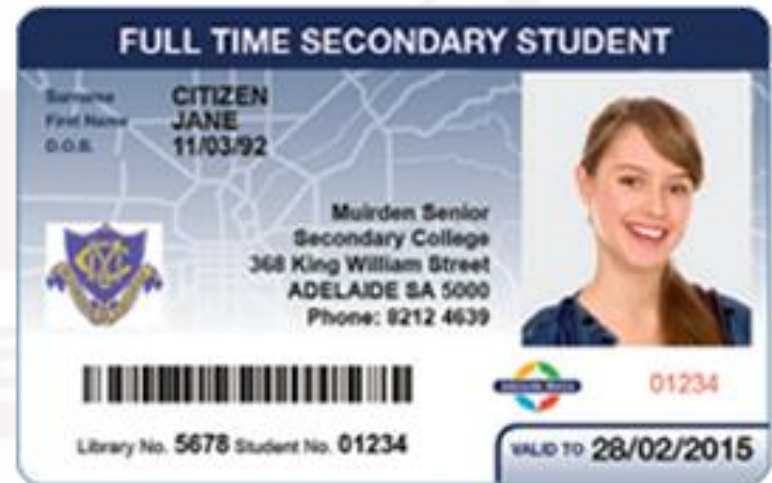
2:40pm- Students Driving

# IDs

# MASKS

Masks must always be worn, unless eating breakfast or lunch in a stationary spot.

Bring an extra mask in your backpack just in case.

It is imperative that you follow this rule.





# BUSES

## In the morning

Students will exit bus one by one in a single file.

Students will proceed through the red gate.

What can a student do once they are on campus?

1. Get breakfast in cafeteria.
  - Students must eat in the cafeteria at a desk.
  - Only when seated can you take your mask off.
  - Students cannot take food out of the cafeteria.
2. Sit on benches around campus where there is a Blue X.
3. Wait outside teacher's classroom 6 feet apart.

## In the afternoon

Students will be dismissed from class.

Bus numbers will be written on whiteboard in bus loop, so students know where their bus is located.

Students will walk immediately to their bus and not loiter or linger around the bus loop.



# OVERFLOW PROCESS

Each room will have total room occupancy permitted posted inside classroom, according to CDC guidelines.

If students enter classroom in excess of this number, students will be assigned to overflow room.

Students attendance will be taken in original classroom.

Students who need to go to overflow room will go to the appropriate room as follows.

- Media Center: Any classroom that has reached capacity.
- Mini-Gym: If your teacher is not on campus.

# MAP AND TRAFFIC PATTERNS

Students will need to follow the blue arrows around the school.



Students need to follow the signs!

Students will need to abide by the designated stairs (Stairs are UP and DOWN only).

Map out your route ahead of time.

Stay 6-feet apart.

# LUNCH TIME

## Two Lunch periods

Lunch A (10:48 AM - 11:24 AM): Career Tech, JROTC, Reading, Language Arts, Science, ESE

Lunch B (12:26 PM - 1:02 PM): Math, PE, Social Studies, World Languages, Culinary, Fine Arts

- Students wanting to go through the lunchline will enter in the east and west entrances.
- Students bringing their lunch can enter in through the most northern east door.
- One student sits at a desk inside cafeteria.
- Students can eat outside on the picnic tables.

# RESTROOMS AND WATER FOUNTAINS

If students must use bathroom, their ID will be their pass.

Students will need to sign out of each classroom using a log provided by the teacher.

Teachers will not let another student out until that student returns.

Restrooms can also be used during class change.

- Make sure to maintain 6-feet apart.

Students cannot use water fountains.

- Students should bring water bottle to refill.
- Only bottle refilling is allowed.



# PARKING

Juniors and Seniors are only eligible to park on campus.

1. Completed a parking registration form.
2. Received administrative approval.
3. Paid \$31.50 fee
4. Picked up parking permit.

Students parking on campus enter lot off Holmberg road and will turn left. No students are to turn right once in the lot.





# DISCIPLINE

The same expectations of appropriate classroom behavior are in play.

# SIGN-OUT PROCEDURES

Virtual sign out procedure: (cut off of 40 min prior to end of day)

- Parent will email [SDHSignout@browardschools.com](mailto:SDHSignout@browardschools.com)
  1. Copy of the Parent's Driver's License
  2. Student's name
  3. Grade Level
  4. Time of Dismissal
  5. Parent Contact Phone Number
- Parent will not come to school to pick up their child until they receive confirmation from student affairs.
- Once confirmed, the parent will come to the front of the school, provide their information to the security staff at the security booth, and drive to the front of the red gates where they will wait for their child
- Student affairs will call the teacher to send the student down.
- Parent will meet student in parking lot.

# SELF-ASSESSMENT COVID CHECKLIST

## Daily Health Screening.

In order to enter Broward County Public Schools facilities, all individuals should answer the following self-assessment questions at home each morning prior to departure:



- Do I feel warm, have a fever or elevated temperature (100.4), or have the chills?
- Do I have a persistent cough, runny nose or sore throat?
- Have I recently had a loss of taste or smell?
- Has anyone in my household tested positive for COVID-19?
- Have I been in close, unprotected contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 (spent longer than 15 minutes within 6 feet of someone who was sick with a fever and cough or confirmed/suspected of having COVID-19?)
- Am I feeling otherwise sick or ill today?
- Am I awaiting test results for COVID-19?
- Have I tested positive for COVID-19?
- Have I been told to self-quarantine or self-isolate by a doctor or District administrator?

**If you can answer “NO” to all of these questions, you may proceed to school or work.**

# EATING AND DRINKING IN CLASS

There is absolutely no eating or drinking inside the classroom.

Students will need to exit classroom in order to take a drink from their water bottle.

No open beverages such as Starbucks, Dunkin Donuts inside the classroom.
